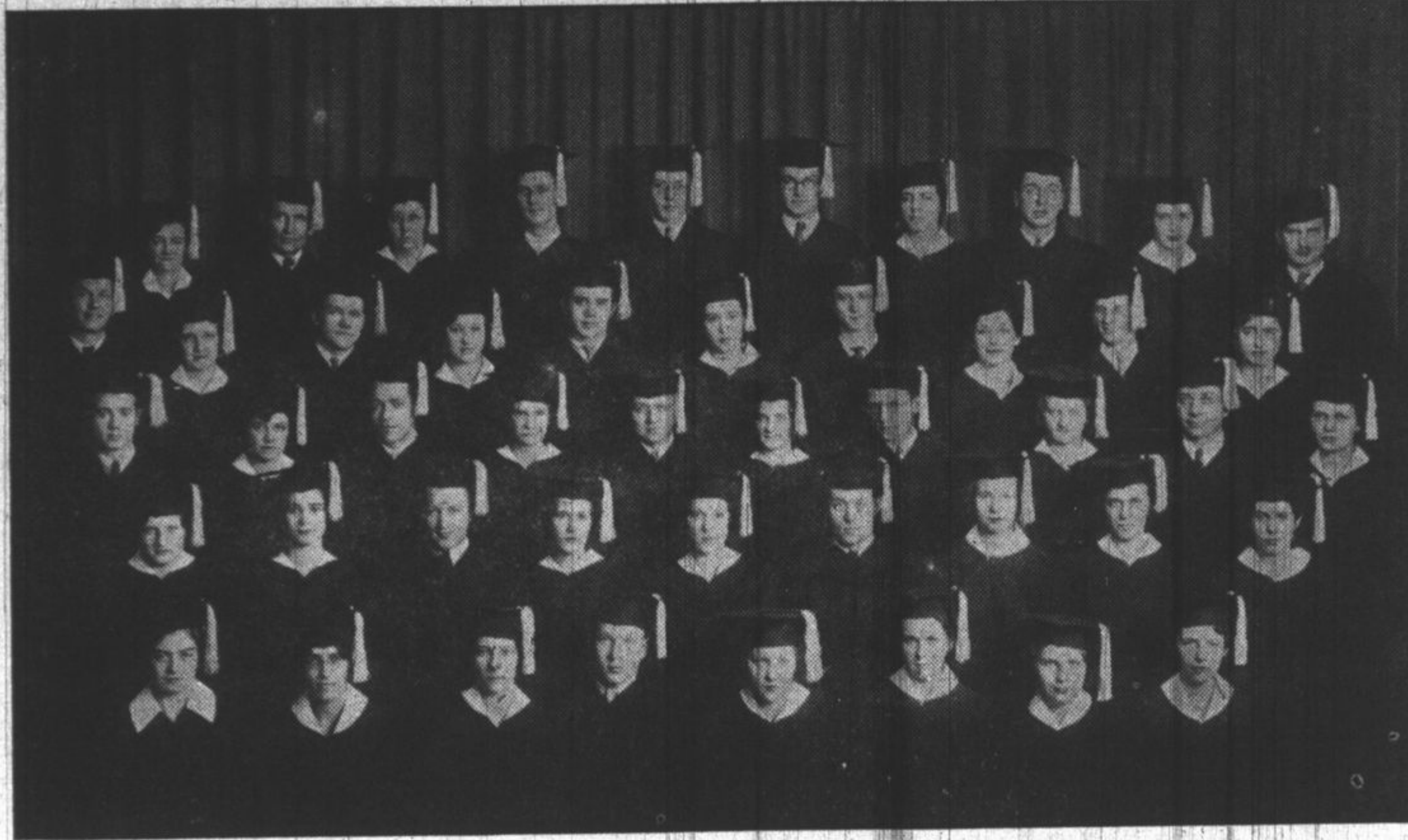


BETHANY CHURCH PRESENTS THE A CAPPELLA CHOIR



Many people of this community, who are interested in good music, will welcome the announcement of the appearance of the A Cappella Choir of Northwestern University in Highland Park. They will present their sacred concert at the Behany Evangelical Church on Thursday, March 22, at 8 p.m. This organization needs no introduction along the North Shore, they have sung in many of the neighboring cities and frequently broadcast over WGN and WMAQ.

This organization was founded in Christian Lutkin, when he was asked the spring of 1906 by Dean Peter to furnish a lecture on early Church music by Mrs. Coe, for the Evanston Woman's Club. Mr. Lutkin was so well pleased with the results of this impromptu choir, that he organized it as a permanent choral organization at the beginning of the school year in 1906. During the years since its founding, the choir has provided opportunity to hundreds of singers of studying the various types of unaccompanied choral music both sacred and secular. The program presented by this choir is a perpetuation of the general plan of the founder.

No admission will be charged for this concert, but an offering will be received. A general invitation is extended to the people of this community to attend.

Braeside P. T. A. Civic Association Program At School On Friday

On Friday evening, at 7:30, the Braeside School will give the parents a glimpse of the progressive work which is going on daily in the school rooms.

The first and second grades will repeat part of the assembly work which Miss Collins presented to the parents on the afternoon of March 7. Miss Siverson, with the fifth and sixth grade pupils, will present a project showing the vital inter-relationship of the various subjects studied in those grades.

The third and fourth grades, in

co-operation with Mrs. Elder, the principal of the school, have worked out a project showing how people thought and lived in this particular part of the country from the time of the Indians to the present day.

In the work of all the grades, the great advantage of having no hard and fast lines between subjects is illustrated. Every subject, whether history, geography, art, civics, reading, dramatic play and construction, or music, draws upon other subjects, and so touches the whole experience of the child so far as possible.

Parents are asked to be prompt. Immediately following the program, refreshments will be served by the social committee.
