

HUDSON ACTS AS SWITCH ENGINE



That the 108 horsepower available in the standard Hudson cars is right there ready for use when needed was aptly demonstrated the other day when it was necessary to move two box cars up to the loading platform at the Hudson factory and no switch engine was available for the purpose at the time.

A chain thrown over the axle of the freight car and around one of the big hulk cross members of the frame the Hudson, plus the applica-

tion of a bit of that 108 horsepower did the trick. The two box cars were towed away to their appointed positions without trouble.

While the owner will never be called upon to tow box cars in his daily use of his car, Hudson officials point out that this ability to move several tons of freight equipment over the rail proves a lot not only as regards the power of the engine, but the ability of the clutch, transmission and rear axle to really "take it."

Funeral Service Is Held Here For the Rev. J. Scott Carr

Funeral services were held in Highland Park the afternoon of Feb. 25 for the Rev. J. Scott Carr, of Winnetka, who died on Feb. 23 at the home of a daughter, Mrs. Luella Carr, at 1073 Gage Street, in that city.

The services here were in charge of the A. O. Fay lodge, A.F. and A. M., and the Boy Scouts of the Order of the Arrow acted as honorary pallbearers, at 1:30 that afternoon.

The principal service was held later that afternoon at the Mundelein Congregational Church, with the Rev. Joseph Taylor, of Highland Park, in charge, assisted by the Rev. F. Brandellner, of Highland Park, and the Rev. Mr. Jevne, of Mundelein. The Odd Fellows lodge also assisted at that service. Burial was at Ivanhoe.

Dr. Carr had retired from the Congregational ministry six years ago, and had lived during the past few years in Winnetka. He had served the ministry 44 years, all of that time except 11 years in Illinois churches. His last charge was at Avon.

He was born in London, England, Feb. 15, 1855. His father was William Carr, M.P., a member of the British House of Lords.

Dr. Carr was educated at Colgate University, Hampton, N.Y., at Oxford College, in England, where he was awarded the Ph.D. degree.

He married Miss Harriett Millard in St. Louis, Mo., on Feb. 12, 1884. Dr. and Mrs. Carr celebrated their

golden wedding anniversary a few days before his death.

Dr. Carr is survived by his widow, three daughters, seven grandchildren and two great grandchildren. The daughters are as follows: Mrs. Luella Carr, of Winnetka; Mrs. Harriett Surber, of Des Moines, Iowa; and Mrs. Eleanor Wetmore, of Onondaga, Ill.
