

Local Schools Will Receive Funds from the Occupation Tax

Lakes County schools this year will receive \$103,000 from the state school fund as their part of the Retailers Occupation Tax, the so-called state sales tax, we are told by K. L. Ames, Jr., director of finance of the State of Illinois.

Local schools will receive proportionate shares of this money, which will be paid from a fund of \$10,500,000 raised by the tax. Heretofore when these monies were appropriated from general taxes, only 90 to 65 per cent were collected. This year the schools will receive a full 100 per cent.

The local school districts will receive the following amounts from the fund:
