CHRISTIAN SCIENCE CHURCHES

"Matter" was the subject of the Lesson-Sermon in all Churches of Christ, Scientist, on Sunday, March 25.

The Golden Text was, "Thou shalt not take the name of the Lord thy God in vain; for the Lord will not hold him guiltless that taketh his name in vain" (Exodus 20:7).

Among the citations which comprised the Lesson-Sermon was the following from the Bible: "Nation shall rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom: And there shall be signs in the sun, and in the moon, and in the stars; and upon the earth distress of nations, with perplexity; the sea and the waves roaring; men's hearts failing them for fear, and for looking after those things which are coming on the earth: for the powers of heaven shall be shaken. And when these things begin to come to pass, then look up, and lift up your heads: for your redemption draweth nigh" (Luke 21:10, 25, 26, 28).

The Lesson-Sermon also included the following passages from the Christian Science textbook, "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures," by Mary Baker Eddy: "This material world is even now becoming the arena for conflicting forces. On one side there will be discord and dismay; on the other side there will be Science and peace. The breaking up of material beliefs may seem to be famine and pestilence, want and woe, sin, sickness, and death, which assume new phases until their nothingness appears. These disturbances will continue until the end of error, when all discord will be swallowed up in spiritual Truth" (p. 96).

The Committee on Professional Ethics of the State Bar Association of Illinois has issued an opinion condemning the practice which now exists in this and other counties, of the County Judge engaging in the private practice of law. The code of ethics of the American Bar Association also opposes the practice of law by a judge in such cases.

If elected County Judge I will be guided by said opinion and will not maintain a private office, nor engage in the practice of law, but will devote all of my time to the duties of County Judge. This will permit me, if elected, to co-operate in relieving the congestion in the Circuit Court by requesting the transfer to the County Court of all appeals from the Justices of the Peace, and I will recommend that all such appeals be taken to the County Court in the future.

This will remove from the Circuit Court hundreds of minor cases and permit the Circuit Judge to devote his time to the more important matters pending before him.
