### Coroner's Jury Holds Accident Unavoidable

The death of two Highland high school girls in an automobile accident March 2 was held unavoidable and accidental by a coroner's jury that completed an inquest in Highland Park late Saturday.

The girls, Bernice Swan and Lena Calbri, were badly injured and fatally burned in the collision on Deerfield Avenue. They were returning from Chicago with Robert Kruse, of Highland, with whom they had attended a play.

They collided with a car driven by James Belmonti, of Highland, who was accompanied by his brother, Frank, and by Peter Summers.

Both cars caught fire and the passengers of each were burned.

The dense fog was blamed by the jurors for the collision.

The inquest was held partly at the Kelley funeral home in Highland Park and partly at the hospital as Mr. Kruse still is a hospital patient.

Assistant State's Attorney Okel S. Fuqua represented the state at the inquest.

The young people were students at the Deerfield-Shields High School.

Coroner J. L. Taylor stated that the evidence showed that the night was so foggy that it was almost impossible to see at all.

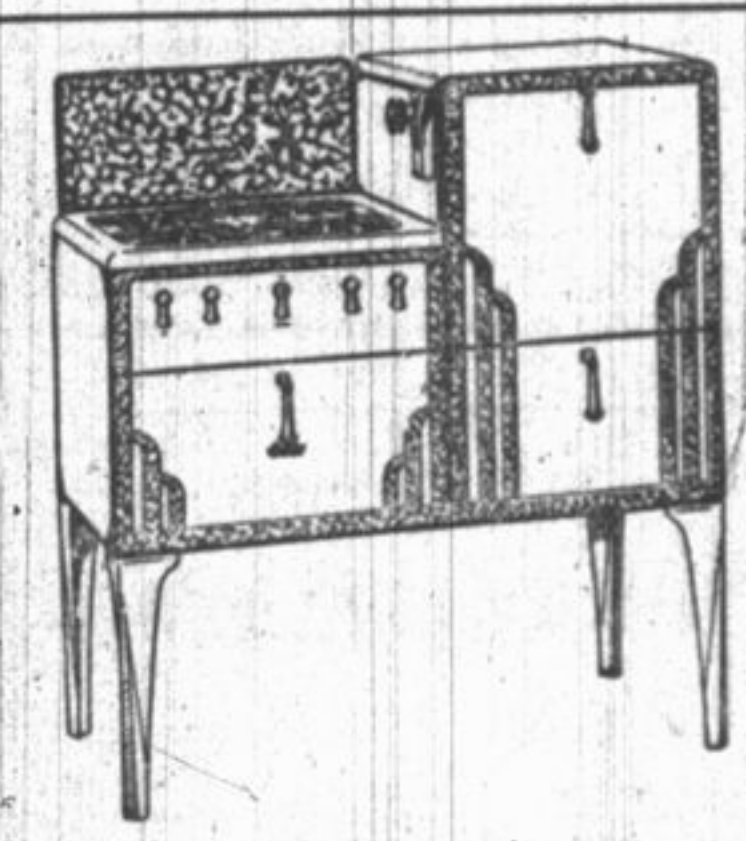
