With an eye toward perfecting their organization and building up to a potent permanency in politics, the Lake County Republican Ex-Service Men's Club Friday night adopted a resolution in their meeting at Grayslake opposing the endorsement of any candidates in the coming primary.

The club was organized too late, members held, to insert itself into the political picture by the way of making endorsements.

The resolution did state, however, that members should give consideration to any ex-service man on the Republican ticket who is qualified to hold the office for which he is bidding.

To have made endorsements, club members pointed out, would have hindered, rather than helped, the plan to weld together a harmonious and effective political unit of G. O. P. ex-service men.

A. J. Sutkus Asking For Support As the "Taxpayers' Friend"

Mr. Sutkus has been assistant supervisor for Waukegan Township since 1929 and when last re-elected was high man on the ticket. He has resided in Lake County since 1901, and lives in Waukegan.

He is secretary of a building and loan association and has been in charge of a sub-postal station since 1921. Mr. Sutkus is also a state oil inspector.

Mr. O'Keefe Has Been Committeeman For 31 Years In This City

John O'Keefe, for 31 years Democratic precinct committeeman in precinct No. 6 in Deerfield Township, is a candidate for re-election in next Tuesday's primary election. Mr. O'Keefe has lived in the precinct for 31 years.

He was elected county chairman in 1907, again in 1922, and has served continuously in that capacity since 1928. The Democratic vote in Lake County has increased from 2,008 in 1924 to 26,667 in 1932.

He has been re-elected secretary-treasurer and manager of the Railway Men's Home 31 consecutive times, and has raised money to erect the Home buildings.

Kindergarten Opens In Deerfield School
