

316 ARE CANDIDATES FOR COMMITTEEMEN

Republicans and Democrats in Local Townships Are Listed Here

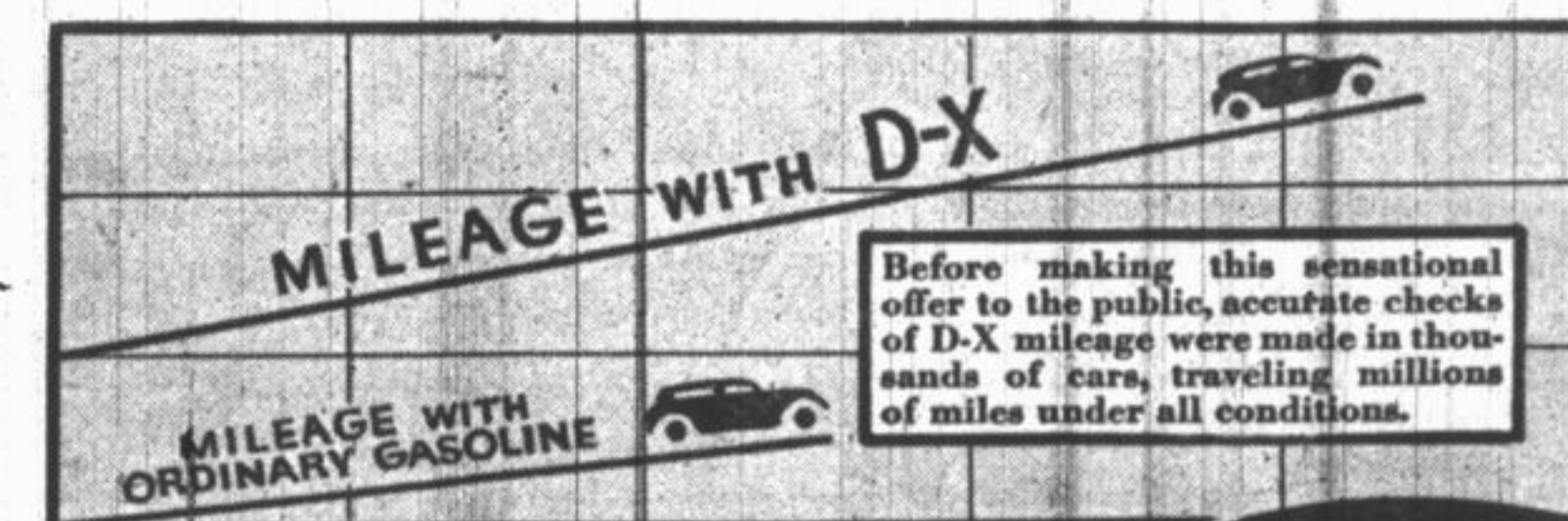
