

DEMOCRATS POLL A BIG VOTE TUESDAY

field Township and 301 votes in West Deerfield Township. Mr. Church received his largest vote in Deerfield Township in the 9th precinct, 172 votes, as against Congressman Simpson's 64 votes in that precinct. Mr. Simpson received his largest vote in Deerfield Township in the 6th precinct, where he received the second highest vote in this township, 354 votes. In West Deerfield Township, Mr. Maloney received 28 votes, while Edward N. Nockels led the five candidates in that township with 68 votes.

Lawrence A. Doolittle, successful Republican candidate for the sheriff nomination, received 858 votes in Deerfield Township, and Edward A. Brown, his opponent, received 1077 votes. Mr. Brown received his highest vote in the 6th precinct, 161 to Mr. Doolittle's 119. Mr. Doolittle received his highest vote in Deerfield Township in the 6th precinct, also.

In West Deerfield Township, Mr. Doolittle received 295 votes, and Mr.

Brown received 281 votes.

Bart Tyrrell, successful Democratic candidate for nomination for sheriff, received 892 votes in Deerfield Township, which was larger than any of his five opponents. Mr. Tyrrell received his largest vote, 135 votes, in the 2nd precinct. In West Deerfield Township, Mr. Tyrrell led with 59 votes.

There were a few unopposed candidates on both tickets. On the Republican ticket, V. C. Petty was unopposed for candidate for county superintendent of schools, and Ralph R. Pihl was unopposed for senatorial committeeman from the eighth district.

On the Democratic ticket, John Stelle was unopposed for candidate for state treasurer, Russ Alford was unopposed for candidate for county clerk, and Frank DeYoe was unopposed for candidate for county superintendent of schools.

William J. Stratton, of Ingelside, former secretary of state, won the Republican nomination for candidate for state treasurer. He was given a big vote in the primary in Lake County, polling 1661 votes in Deerfield Township, and 400 votes in West Deerfield Township. His closest opponent in Deerfield Township was Carl L. Anderson, who received

only 119 votes in the twelve precincts.

Republican state representatives Richard Lyons and William M. Carroll, and Democratic state representative Thomas A. Bolger, were all renominated for their offices.

Mr. Lyons polled 2941 votes in Deerfield Township, and 972 1/2 votes in West Deerfield Township. Mr. Carroll received 609 votes in Deerfield Township, and 128 votes in West Deerfield Township. Mr. Bolger polled 918 votes in Deerfield Township, and 84 votes in West Deerfield Township.

Francis G. Blair was nominated a candidate for his present office of state superintendent of public instruction on the Republican ticket, and will be opposed this fall by John A. Wieland, the Democratic nominee. Mr. Blair received 1384 votes in Deerfield Township, and 442 votes in West Deerfield Township. Mr. Wieland received 691 votes in Deerfield Township and 57 votes in West Deerfield Township.

Low Hendee, county clerk, was nominated on the Republican ticket to be a candidate for his office, and will be opposed by Mr. Alford, who was unopposed on the Democratic

ticket. Mr. Hendee received 1174 votes in Deerfield Township, while his Republican opponent for the nomination, Mancel Talcott, received 562 votes in this township. In West Deerfield Township, Mr. Hendee received 339 votes, and Mr. Talcott, 213.

Probate Judge Martin C. Decker was the successful Republican nominee for his office this fall, and will be opposed by Charles Noll, the Democratic nominee. Judge Decker received 949 votes in Deerfield Township and 287 votes in West Deerfield Township. Mr. Noll received 714 votes in Deerfield Township and 89 votes in West Deerfield Township.

County Judge Perry L. Persons received the Republican nomination for his office this fall, and will be opposed by A. C. McHenry on the Democratic ticket. Judge Persons received 1046 votes in Deerfield Township to 743 for his Republican opponent, Harry A. Hall. Mr. McHenry received only 307 votes in Deerfield Township, while his Democratic opponent, Philip J. McKenna, of Highland Park, received 1001. In West Deerfield Township, Mr. McKenna received 80 votes to Mr. McHenry's 66. Also in that township,

Judge Persons received 280 votes, and Mr. Hall, 269.

Allen Nelson received the Republican nomination for county treasurer, and A. J. Sutkus received the Democratic nomination for the same office. In Deerfield Township, Mr. Nelson received 718 votes, while Edwin Burgess of Lake Forest, received 752, and John J. Hogan received 395. In West Deerfield Township, Mr. Nelson received 143 votes, Mr. Burgess received 278, and Mr. Hogan received 110.

Mr. Sutkus received only 95 votes in Deerfield Township, and 16 votes in West Deerfield Township. Daniel L. Cobb, of Highland Park, one of Mr. Sutkus' three opponents, polled 783 Democratic votes in this township, and 32 in West Deerfield Township. Peter J. Duffy, of Deerfield, polled 489 votes in Deerfield Township, and 118 votes in West Deerfield Township, for the same office.

John R. Bullock received the Republican nomination for probate clerk, and Walter Koziol received the Democratic nomination for that office.

Mr. Bullock received 920 Republican votes in Deerfield Township, and 177 in West Deerfield Township. Mr. Koziol received 469 votes in

Deerfield Township, while his Democratic opponent for the nomination, John J. Rink, received 699 votes in this township. In West Deerfield Township, Mr. Rink received 128 votes and Mr. Koziol received only 37.

For congressmen-at-large, the Republicans nominated C. Wayland Brooks and Milton E. Jones, and the Democrats nominated Martin A. Brennan and Michael I. Igoe. Both local townships gave large pluralities for all four candidates.
