DEERFIELD REMAINS WET AFTER ELECTION

Taverns to Stay in Village by 438 to 398 Vote on Tuesday

Deerfield remained "wet" Tuesday, April 17, at the village election by 40 votes. To the question: "Shall the sale at retail of alcoholic liquor be prohibited in the village of Deerfield?" the vote was—No, 438; and Yes, 398.

The contest for village clerk was the closest and the victor, Chester Wessling, defeated Ralph Horenberger by two votes. William Bickford defeated William Johnston for the office of police magistrate and the three trustees elected are C. M. Willman; Ralph Peterson and M. A. Pottenger.

There were 849 votes cast in the two precincts as follows:

For Clerk: Chester Wessling, 277 votes; Ralph Horenberger, 275 votes; Homer Cazel, 261 votes.

For Police Magistrate: William Bickford, 437 votes; William Johnston, 354 votes.

For Village Trustees: C. M. Willman, 496 votes; Ralph Peterson, 488 votes; M. A. Pottenger, 388 votes; Charles Scavuzzo, 303 votes; Torvald G. Johnson, 280 votes; Robert Cole, 186 votes.
