

Mr. McKenna Loses the Nomination for Judge by 66 Votes

Philip McKenna, of Highland Park, lost the Democratic nomination for county judge of Lake County in last week's primary election to A. C. McHenry, of Waukegan, by only 66 votes, an official canvass of the votes last week revealed.

After the canvass of votes was made, the winners in the primary were announced as follows:

For congressman from 10th district—Republican, Ralph Church; Democrat, David Maloney.

For congressmen at large—Republican, C. Wayland Brooks and Milton E. Jones; Democrat, Martin A. Brennan and Michael I. Igoe.

For state treasurer—Republican, William J. Stratton; Democrat, John Stelle (unopposed).

For state superintendent of public instruction—Republican, Francis G. Blair; Democrat, John A. Wieland.

For state representatives—Republican, Richard J. Lyons and William A. Carroll; Democrat, Thomas A. Bolger.

For county judge—Republican, Perry Persons; Democrat, A. C. McHenry.

For county clerk—Republican, Lew A. Hendee; Democrat, Russ Alford (unopposed).

For probate judge—Republican, Martin C. Decker; Democrat, Charles Noll.

For probate clerk—Republican, John Bullock; Democrat, Walter Koziol.

For county treasurer—Republican, Allen J. Nelson; Democrat, A. J. Sutkus.

For sheriff—Republican, Lawrence Doolittle; Democrat, Bart Tyrrell.

For county superintendent of schools—Republican, W. C. Petty (unopposed); Democrat, Frank De Yoe (unopposed).

Waukegan Rejects a Proposal for City-Owned Power Plant

By a vote of more than three to one, citizens of Waukegan, rejected a proposal toward the establishment of a municipally-owned and operated electric light and power plant for their city at the polls early this week. (April 17).

While the issue before Waukegan voters was only the initial step in the direction of the establishment of a municipal plant, its decisive defeat is taken as an important indication of the public attitude toward municipal plants in cities already adequately served with electricity from other sources.

Those opposed to the city-owned plant pointed to the fact that municipal plants have not generally brought lower electric rates in Illinois, whereas the record of the privately operated electric system serving Waukegan showed eight voluntary rate reductions in the past twenty years. Further emphasis was placed upon the cost of the proposed preliminary survey and the estimated cost of a municipal plant which, at the outset, would have been of questionable economic value to taxpayers of the community.

Holy Cross Basketball Team Ends Its Season

The Holy Cross Church basketball team of Deerfield closed its season by finishing third in the C. Y. O. League, DesPlaines branch, with six wins and four losses. The Crosses finished sixth in 1931 and fifth in 1932.

Under the coaching of Rev. McDonough in 1930, the Catholics played 44 free lance games, winning 24 out of 40 games. The Black and Orange reached the second round in two tournaments, in addition to the league games, the Northern Illinois and first annual Park Ridge meet, this year. Holy Cross played two exhibition games against north shore teams, losing to the Highwood Legion, minus the services of their tall center, Bid Tillman, and the

Lyman Tevacos of Wilmette. Veterans of the team are Joseph Male and Lorry McDermott, guards, fourth season players. New men are Dean, leading scorer, Berndtson, Orsborn, and Claude McDermott, forwards, Tillman and Horn, centers, and Thompson and Duffy, guards. During the four years of play, Holy Cross' two best players were Silver, all-league guard 1931, and Sticks Powers, 1930, who later played with the DePaul U., and the Piggly-Wiggly's of Denver. 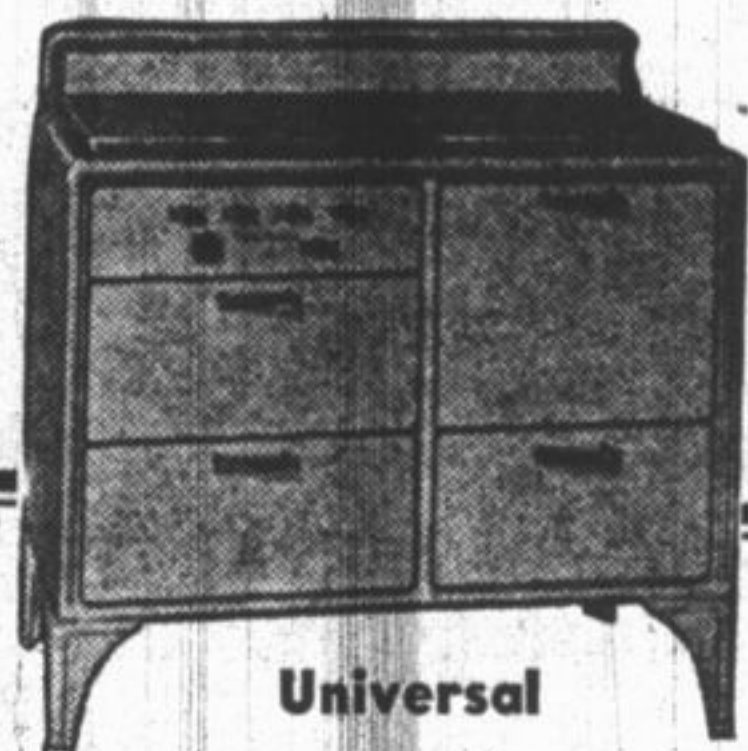

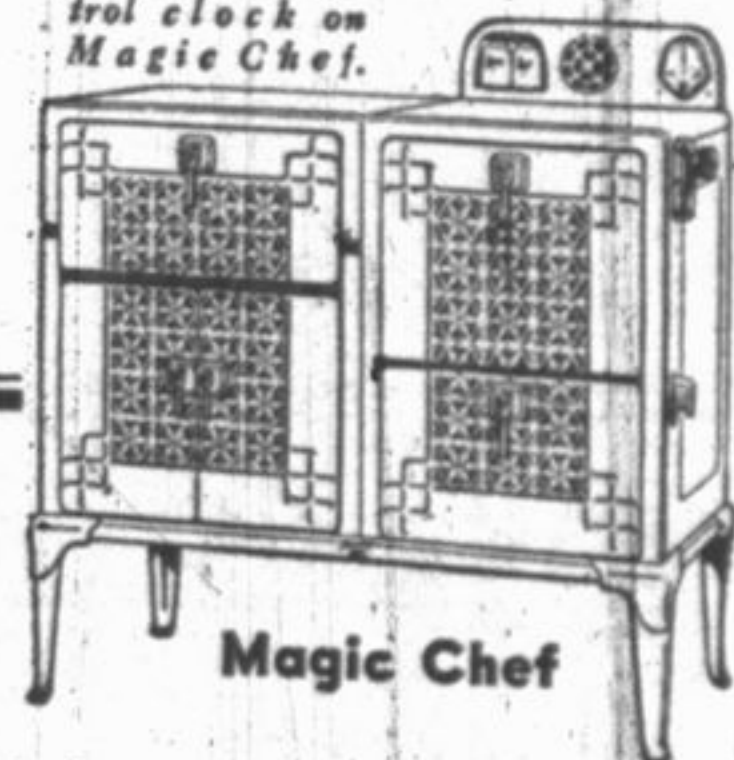
