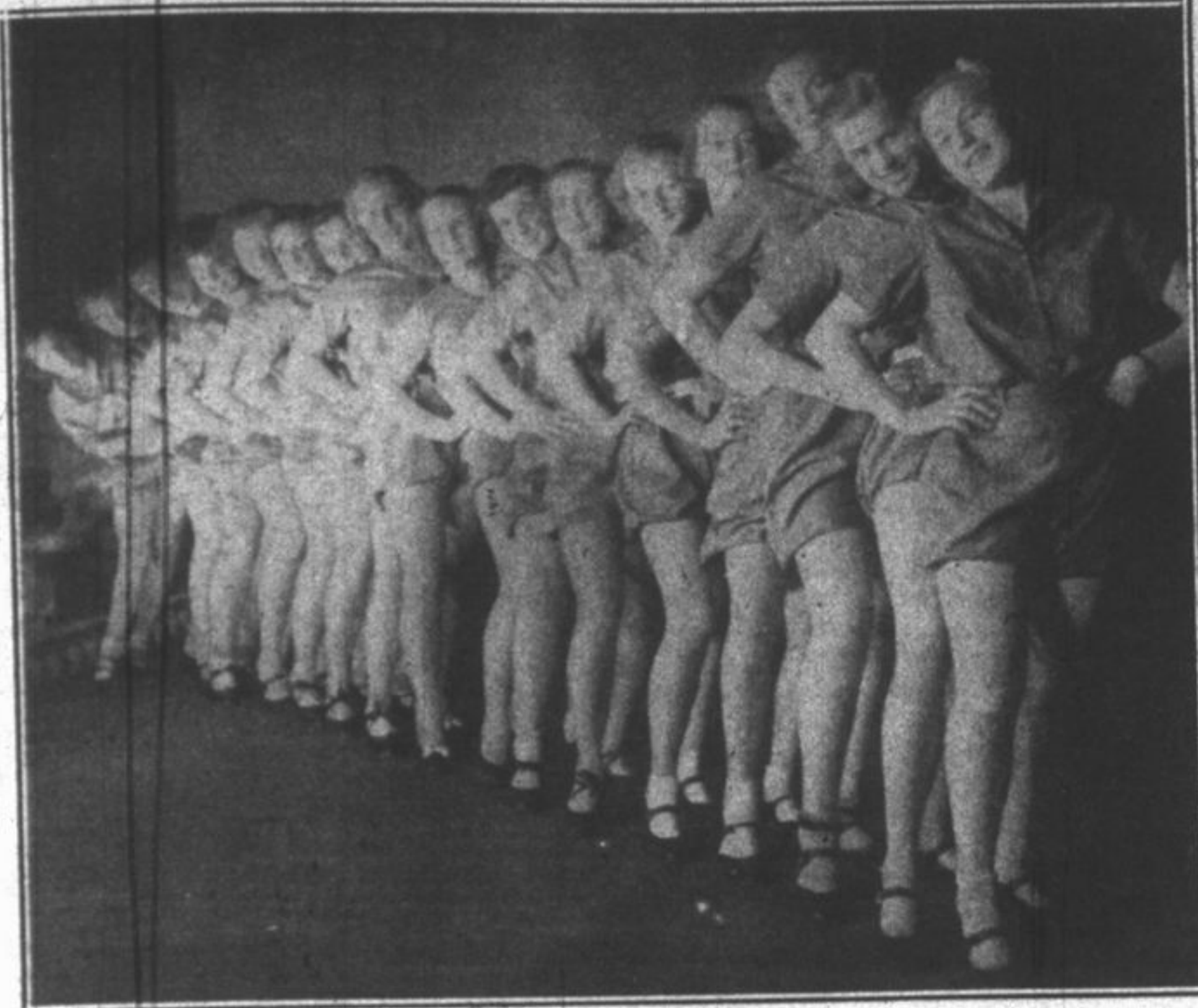


Tappers Practice For "Stunts"

Foreign Relations To Be Discussed at N. U.

Europe, Asia and all sections of the United States will be represented by the lecturers who are to participate in the Midwest Institute of International Relations at Northwestern University June 25 to July 6 under the auspices of the American Friends Service committee (Quakers). Fong Foo Sec, member of the Board of Directors of Rotary International and for twelve years chairman of the National Committee of the Y.M.C.A. in China, will head the courses and round table discussions on the "Orient in World Affairs," with Grover Clark, author and former professor in the National University of Peking.

Dr. Leyton Richards, minister of Carr's Lane Congregational Church Birmingham England and one of England's most noted preachers will head the section on the "Spiritual Aspects of the Struggle for World Peace," together with Dr. Ernest F. Tittle, minister of the First Methodist Church of Evanston. James Weldon Johnson, famous for his collection of negro spirituals and whose recent autobiography, "Along This Way," has created a great deal of comment, will head the section on the "Negro in American Life."

Other lecturers are Quincy Wright, professor of international law at the University of Chicago; Grayson Kirk, assistant professor of political science at the University of Wisconsin; W. C. Dennis, president of Earlham College; and Charles E. Chapman, professor of history at the University of California.

This is the third year the Institute of International Relations has been held at Northwestern University. Courses and discussions are arranged to help formulate effective programs for teachers in public and private schools, ministers, college students, leaders in clubs and civic organizations such as the Y.M.C.A., Y.W.C.A., Rotary Club, League of Women Voters, etc.

40-Foot Super-Road To Be Built Through Glencoe This Spring

Construction on the long-awaited north and south concrete super-highway through Glencoe, extending over a two and one-quarter mile route from Scott Avenue, at the village's southern extremity, to the northern limits at Ravinia, was started last week.

The cost of the entire project, which includes a bypass and an underpass in addition to the paving of a forty-foot right-of-way through the village, will be about \$250,000. The Public Works Administration is aiding in the cost of the project, giving a grant of about \$84,000, covering 30 per cent of the cost of labor and materials.

This Glencoe link is the final stretch of the superhighway west of the Chicago and North Western right of way from Evanston to Highland Park. There is one section of Evanston's link still uncompleted, but otherwise the highway is complete.

Through Glencoe the route will flank the west side of the railroad right-of-way, but at the North School where Green Bay Road crosses the tracks the route will swing to the northwest, and will then head north to the south limits of Ravinia.

The roadway should be completed and open to the public in about three months, engineers estimate.

Young Men's Club To Begin Baseball Season

The first game of the Highland Park Young Mens Club baseball season will be played at Sunset Park Sunday, May 13. The opposition on this day will be the Westside A. C. of Waukegan, formerly the Cosovers.

The local Young Mens Club is headed and coached by a well remembered baseball player, George Hesler. The personnel of the club is much the same as last year. With the addition of a few new local players, Coach Hesler looks for a very good season.

"Poppy Day" Here To Be Saturday, May 26

Memorial poppies, which the women of the American Legion Auxiliary will distribute here on "Poppy Day," May 26, have been a means of providing employment to hundreds of disabled World War veterans through the winter and spring months. The little red flowers have made possible earnings of approximately \$100,000 for these disabled men.

The poppies are made in government hospitals and in special poppy workrooms maintained by the Auxiliary. This year 58 different poppy making centers have been in operation in 40 states. Employment is restricted to men unable to do work of other types of work and preference is given those with families to support. The paper poppy is used exclusively by the Auxiliary because its making is a hand rather than a machine process.
