So God created man in his own image, in the image of God created he him; male and female created he them. And God saw everything that he had made, and behold, it was very good" (Genesis 1:26, 27, 31).

The Lesson-Sermon also included the following passages from the Christian Science textbook, "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures," by Mary Baker Eddy: "Human capacity is slow to discern and to grasp God's creation and the divine power and presence which go with it, demonstrating its spiritual origin" (p. 519).

Annual Convention of Scandinavian Lodge To Be Here This Week

The District Lodge No. 6 of the Scandinavian Fraternity of America will hold its annual convention Friday and Saturday, May 18 and 19, in the Masonic Temple, Highland Park. There will be approximately sixty delegates from Illinois, Iowa, Indiana and other neighboring states. The conventions headquarters will be the Moraine Hotel.

In addition to its regular transaction of fraternal business there is arranged a very interesting program. Mayor E. B. Metzger will give the welcoming address Friday morning and also be the principal speaker at the banquet Saturday evening. There will be dancing and other entertainment provided both Friday and Saturday evenings. If time permits the Highland Park police department will provide a motorcycle escort for a sight seeing trip about the city and vicinity.

The Scandinavian Fraternity is one of the strongest and largest organizations of its kind in the country. In addition to providing social privileges, it maintains a mutual funeral fund and also a sick benefit fund. The Highland Park Lodge, Chapter No. 171, composed of some 125 members, has been one of the most successful lodges in the district.

To be eligible for this organization, one must be Scandinavian by birth or descent, or related by marriage, providing one is between the ages of sixteen and fifty years and is of the Caucasian race.

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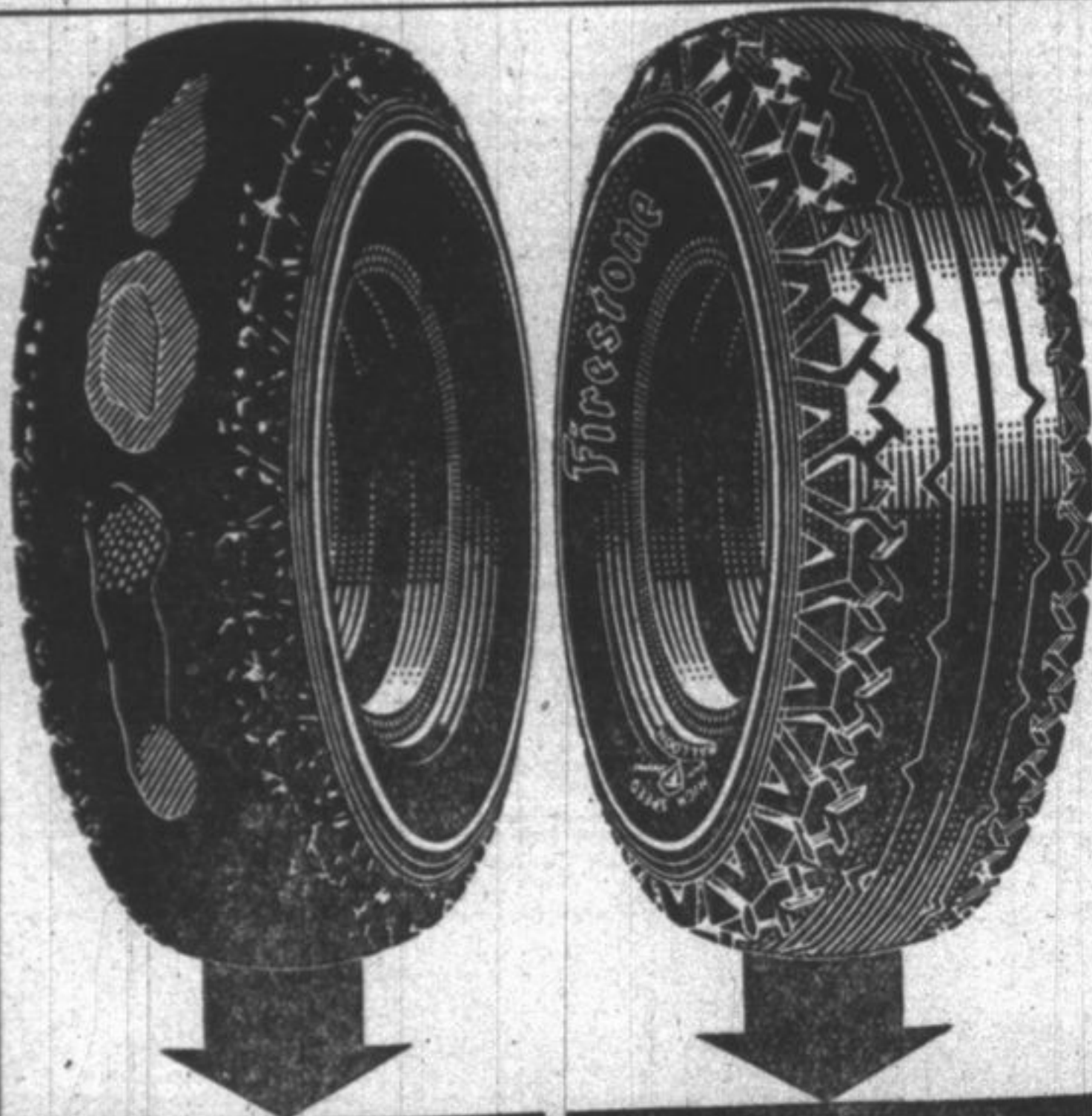
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
