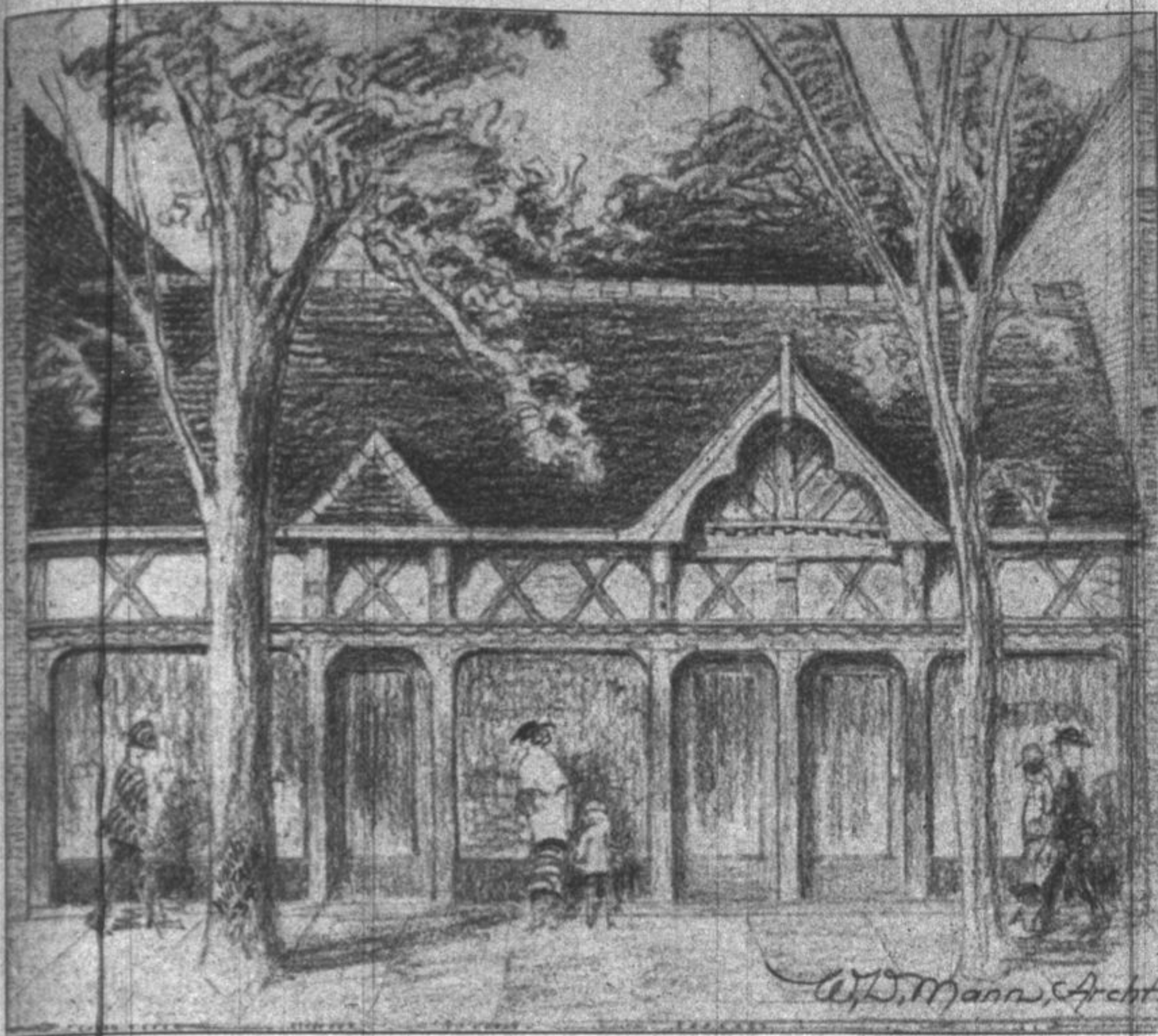


New Central Avenue Building



An attractive addition to the business section of Highland Park is the new store building just completed at 372 Central Avenue by W. D. Mann, architect, for Hill & Stone, realtors. The building, which contains three stores, is French Provincial with a Normandy influence, according to Mr. Mann, and is in keeping with the suburban atmosphere of the community. The weathered tile on the Mansard roof greatly enhances the external appearance of the building. Lucile Ullman, interior decorator, who was formerly located on South St. Johns Avenue, is occupying the east store for her studio and gift shop. Nemeroff, Jewelers, have moved from 392 Central Avenue to occupy the center store where they now have one of the most attractive jewelry shops on the North Shore. Hill & Stone, one of the oldest real estate and insurance firms in Highland Park, have retained the west store for their new office.

Lumber Firm Is Selling 75,000 Wisconsin Acres

Under a new policy the Edward Hines Farm Land Company, subsidiary of the Edward Hines Lumber Company of Chicago, is closing out 75,000 acres of land in northern Wisconsin. No attempt is being made to bring market price on this land, officials state, as it is planned to sell out this acreage in small and large tracts in the shortest possible time. Located in the fertile valleys of the Chippewa and Flambeau rivers, all types of land including farm land, lake and river lands, some well timbered, natural hunting and fishing locations are available to the public at prices as low as \$1.50 an acre. The property is located about 400 miles north of Chicago and all sales are being made through the company land office at Winter, Wis.

King of Winnetka, president of the Cook County League; Mrs. Alfred D. Kohn of Chicago, vice-president of Illinois League of Women Voters, and Mrs. Ralph B. Treadway of Glen Ellyn, past president of the Illinois League. In view of the importance of the proposed changes it is expected that a large delegation will be present, not only of state and local League chairmen, but also of the regular League members, who are cordially invited to attend. Modenese Society Will Have Picnic on June 10

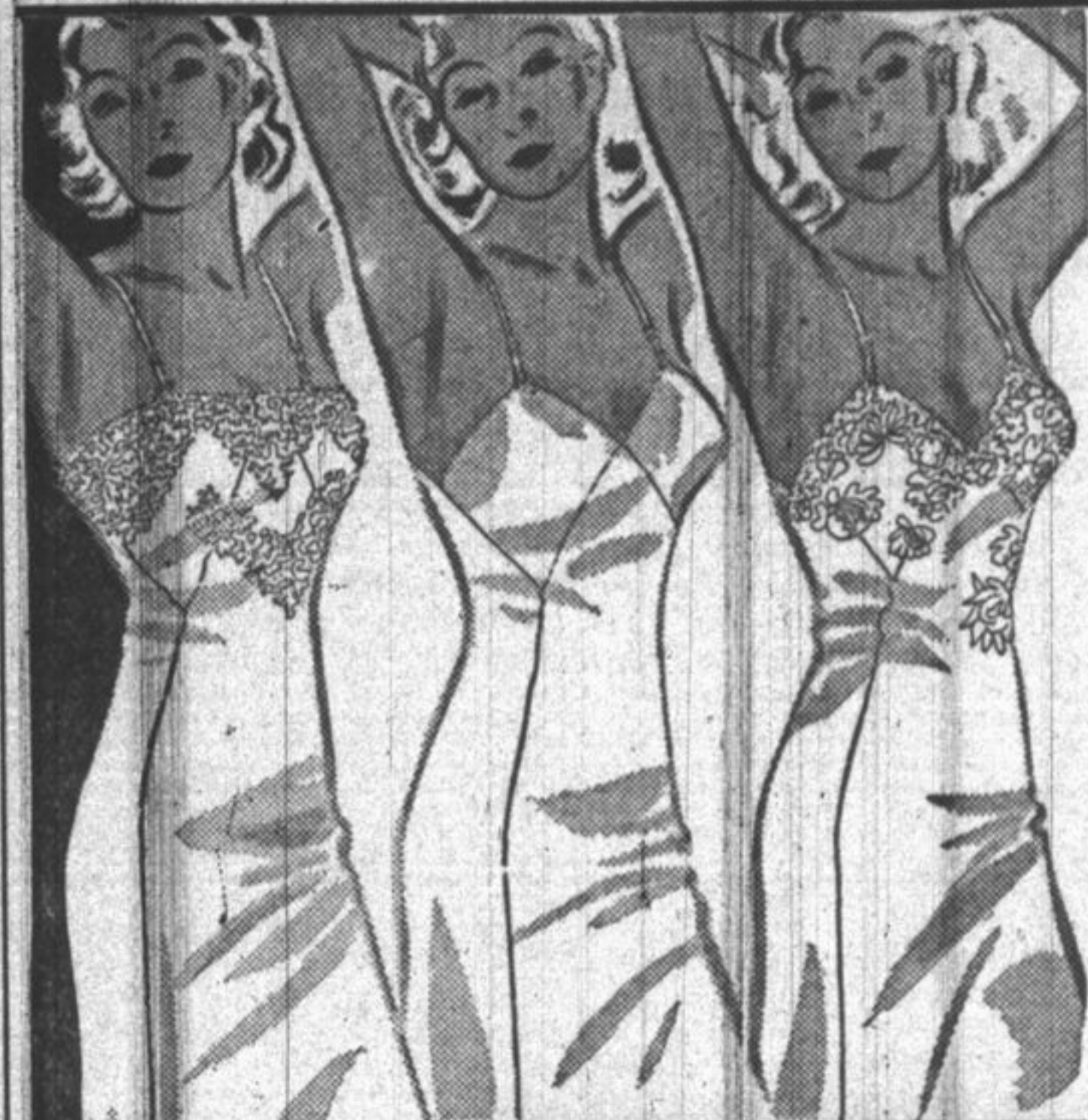
