International Affairs
Specialists in their fields from all parts of the United States and from England will lead the courses in political and economic affairs which will be given by the Midwest Institute of International Affairs at Northwestern University June 25 to July 12.

Fong Foo Sec, chairman of the national committee of the Y.M.C.A. in China for twelve years, will lead the section on "Orient in World Affairs." Dr. Leyton Richards, a noted English minister, together with Dr. Ernest Tittle of Evanston will conduct the group on "The Spiritual Aspects of the Struggle for World Peace." Dr. Tittle is the author of "The Foolishness of Preaching, and Jesus After Nineteen Centuries. The forum and discussion on "The Negro in American Life" will be led by James Weldon Johnson, author of "Along This Way, Autobiography of an Ex-Colored Man, editor of The Book of American Negro Poetry, The Book of American Negro Spirituals, and The Second Book of Negro Spirituals.

The significance of an understanding of world politics is more important than ever before in a world of chaos in order to promote world peace and fellowship. The library has many important books on this subject, and has exhibited some of them in the lobby cases this week.

Interesting Personalities
A Backward Glance, by Edith Wharton. An entertaining biography by this prominent contemporary writer, which is crowded with reminiscences of her active social life as well as the story of her career as an artist.

Memories of My Childhood, by Selma Lagerlof. Delightful autobiography of the Swedish novelist's childhood days in a cultured family.

The New Dealers, by the Unofficial Observer. Shrewd appraisals and good reading in this book which gives the backgrounds and personalities of the president, cabinet members and others who figure in the Washington scene.

The Robber Barons, by Matthew Josephson. An important and thoroughly readable contribution to American history. A striking study of the group of "empire-builders" who arose at the time of the Civil War, found this country a mercantile-agrarian democracy, and left it an industrial society.

Paderewski, by C. J. M. Phillips. The first full-length biography in English of the Polish musician and patriot with a wealth of anecdote and intimate detail. A list of Paderewski's compositions is appended.

More Or Less About Myself, by Margot Oxford. Bouquets and brickbats fly with equal vigour in all directions. She was well acquainted with most of the political leaders of England from Gladstone on; she was a personal friend of King Edward and Queen Alexandra; she came from one brilliant family and married into another.

"Good Books that Almost Nobody Has Read"

In the New Republic for the week of April 18 is an interesting article on valuable books which have been overlooked by the reading public, compiled from the various lists sent in by Sinclair Lewis, Edmund Wilson, Conrad Aiken, and other novelists and critics.

Here are some of the neglected books which are to be found at the library:

The Glastonbury Romance, by J. C. Powys. An authentic drama of the human soul.

The Devil, by Alfred Neumann. A retelling of Scott's Kuentin Durdward.

Greenbanks, by Dorothy Whipple. A middle-class English novel.

The Human Body, The Care & Feeding of Adults, Behind the Doctor by Dr. Logan Clendenning. A popular anatomy, a popular physiology, and a popular history of medicine make up this trio.

History of Italian Literature, by M. De Sanctis. Written with patient scholarship and in beautiful prose.

"Dividend Returns" in "Rekindled Imagination" were furnished by books of fiction, literature,

biography, and fine arts.

"Refreshed Mentality" in books of science, business, foreign languages, and history.

"Peace and Serenity" in books of philosophy and religion.

Service Men Travel
315,497 Miles a Year

Twelve times around the world, or 315,497 miles to be exact, is the distance that was covered by automobiles and trucks used by North Shore Gas Company employees in rendering and maintaining service for customers in the North Shore district during the year 1933. This figure may be something of a surprise to readers who have thought of the gas distribution system only as a network of pipes through which any amount of gas could be pumped.

A study of the mileage report reveals that it was occasioned by such routine tasks as removing meters for testing, servicing appliances, inspecting mains, checking pressures in mains, setting pressure governors, making readings of heat content, replacing old equipment, watching for leaks, and connecting new meters in service.

Gas company officials point out that this mileage would undoubtedly

be much greater were it not for the fact that remote control gages and automatic valves are used wherever possible. An interconnected telephone system also helps to eliminate many routine calls.

North Western to Give Bus Rides to the Fair

Thomson, passenger traffic manager of the road, announces.

These tickets will be good on all trains leaving the starting station at 8 a.m., daylight saving time, or later. They will be sold from stations Main St. in Evanston to Waukegan, inclusive, Edison Park to Crystal Lake, inclusive, Weber to Emerson St. in Evanston, inclusive, also Niles Center, and Bellwood to Geneva, inclusive.

Both street cars and buses leave frequently from the Madison Street Station to the various Fair gates and it is possible, by use of transfers, to reach almost any gate desired.
