The recreation program for the adult groups is being carried on three evenings a week: Monday, Tuesday, and Thursday, from 6:30 until 8, at the Lincoln playground. Facilities are available for badminton, baseball, volley ball and horse shoes, and may be used on any of the above evenings. The tennis courts at Sunset Park are also reserved for adults on any evenings of the week and are now in good shape.

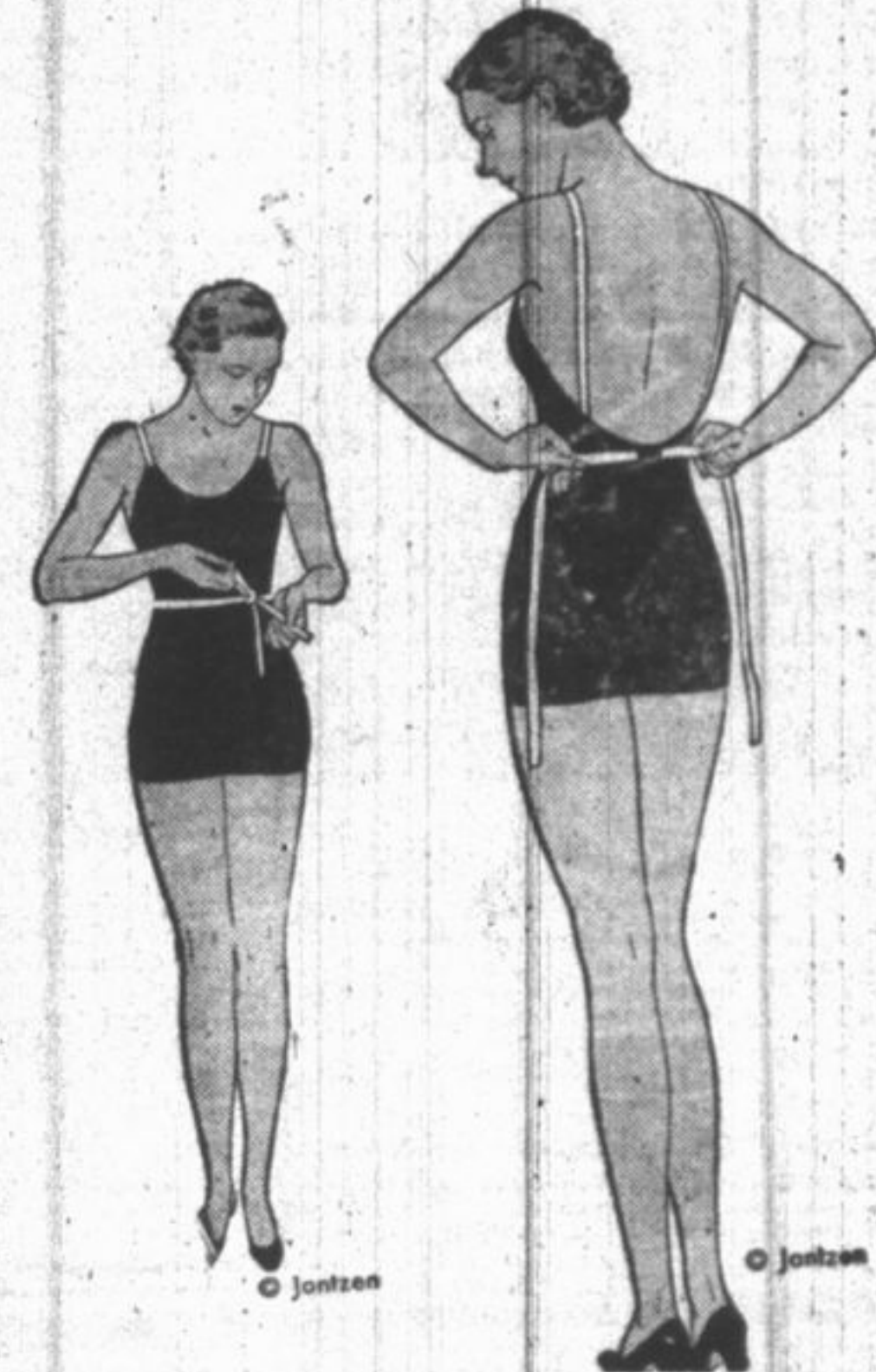
