

Jim McMillen and Lou Plummer Will Wrestle Tomorrow

Just who is the heavyweight wrestling champion of Lake County will be decided tomorrow night (Friday), when Jim McMillen of Antioch and Lou Plummer of Waukegan climb through the ropes to settle their six year dispute at Renehan's new open-air arena at Round Lake.

The Antioch star and the Waukegan "Wild man" finished training for their battle and each appear in the pink of condition. Plummer will carry an eighteen-pound weight advantage as he will enter the ring at 239 while McMillen will scale 221 pounds.

The bout, which has stirred up much bitter rivalry between the followers of the two men, is almost traditional in character as it will be a battle for "glory and honor rather than for gold."

While the main attraction will be the Plummer-McMillen championship go, the preliminary matches should also keep the spectators in an uproar during the early part of the evening. Matchmaker White has selected several of the leading wrestlers for these matches. In the semi-windup, "Buckets" Goldenberg, Milwaukee's sensational young wrestler and Green Bay Packers football star, is pitted against a rough and tough customer in George Mack, Chicago rowdy and Bohemian champion.

In the event of rain the show will be postponed to the following day, Saturday, June 30.
