Miss Margaret Bott Kills Herself at Des Moines With Revolver

Miss Margaret Bott, 22 years old, of Highland Park, died in Des Moines, Iowa, Thursday of last week from a self-inflicted bullet wound, just a week and day after her mother, Mrs. Alice King Bott, drowned in Lake Michigan in a "suicide pact" with her daughter.

The daughter, who was taken to Des Moines after the tragedy here, killed herself in the home of her uncle and aunt, Dr. and Mrs. W. W. Pearson. She shot herself with a revolver Wednesday night, and died the next day of shock and internal hemorrhage.

The body was cremated, as was that of her mother.

Executive of Armour Company Dies Here Of Self-Inflicted Wound

Fred James Reynolds, 53, vice-president of the Armour Packing Company, died Thursday of last week at the Highland Park Hospital of self-inflicted bullet wounds.

Mr. Reynolds shot himself in the bathroom of his home at 1020 Bluff Road, Glencoe. He was despondent over ill health, it is said.

Private funeral services were held Saturday at the home.

Anti-Aircraft Target Practice at the Fort

A warning to all boats to keep 7,500 yards off shore in the vicinity of Fort Sheridan during the next six weeks has been issued by Lt. W. K. Liebel, plans and training officer at the post.

Beginning Thursday of last week and continuing until July 30 anti-aircraft target practice will be held at Fort Sheridan, and the shore line within range of the guns will be made a danger zone.

Highwood Prohibits Sale of Fireworks

Sale of fireworks within the city limits of Highwood has been prohibited, according to an ordinance passed at the city council meeting last week.

The ordinance went into effect early this week. Most North Shore communities, except No. Man's Land, between Wilmette and Kenilworth, prohibit the sale of fireworks.
