It is this spiritual perception of Scripture, which lifts humanity out of disease and death and inspires faith" (p. 547).

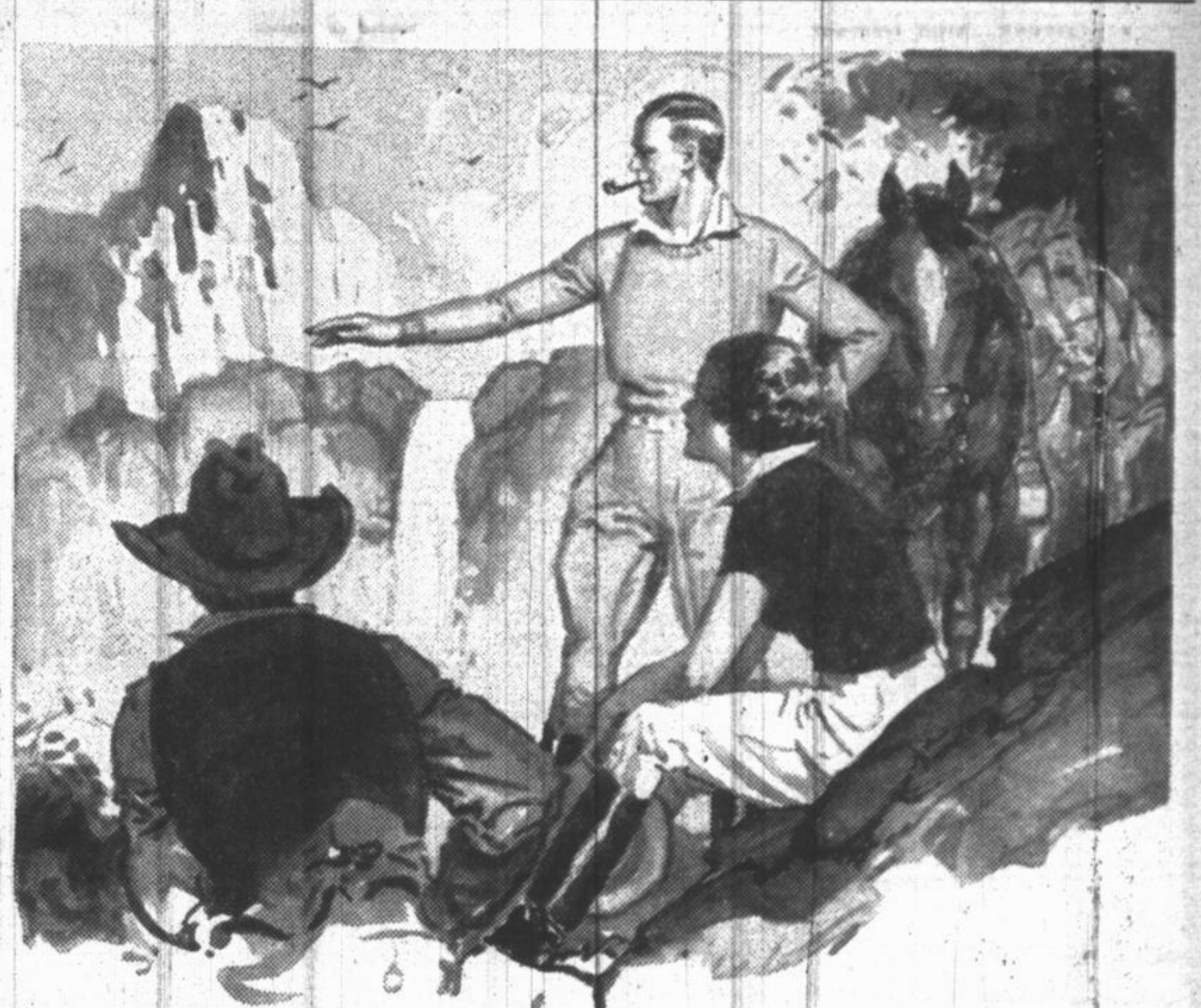
