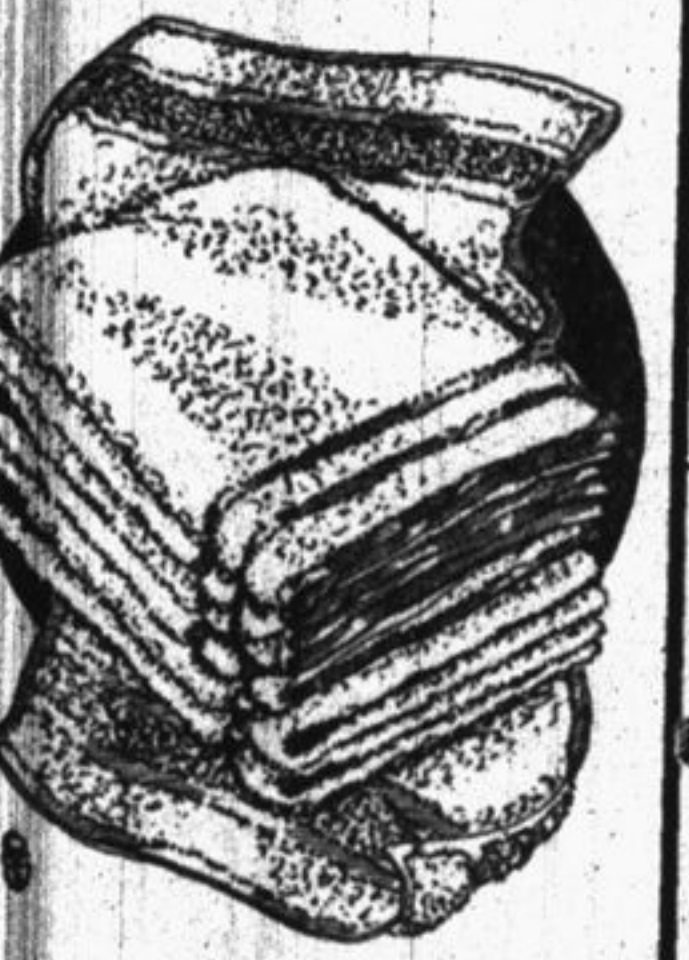

Drain water from cooling system.
Remove distributor head and wiring assembly.
Remove cylinder head.
Clean carbon from cylinder head and top of pistons.
Remove valve cover plate, valve springs, valves and push rods.
Clean carbon from valves and valve stem guides.
Inspect valve faces for pits and valve stems for alignment.
Reface valves, using Sioux Electric Refacing Machine.
Reseat valve seats, using Sioux Valve Grinding Equipment.
Clean valve ports thoroughly.
Replace valves, push rods and valve springs.
Replace cylinder head with new gasket. Tighten cylinder head nuts in proper sequence.
Replace distributor and wiring assembly.
Replace cylinder head thermometer and refill cooling system. Inspect water hoses.

Reset ignition timing.
Clean carburetor.
Remove spark plugs, clean and test in testing machine. Adjust to standard clearance and replace, using new gaskets.
Remove, face off, and replace and adjust distributor points.
Adjust fan belt to proper tension.
Adjust timing chain.
Clean vacuum tank screen or fuel pump screen and suction elbow.
Clean gasoline filter and inlet screen.
Remove carburetor air cleaner, clean, oil and replace.
Start motor and allow to run for five minutes to warm up.
Tighten cylinder base nuts.
Tighten intake and exhaust manifold nuts.
Retighten cylinder head nuts.
Adjust valve tappets to standard clearance.
Replace valve cover plate tightly.
Tighten water pump packing nut.
