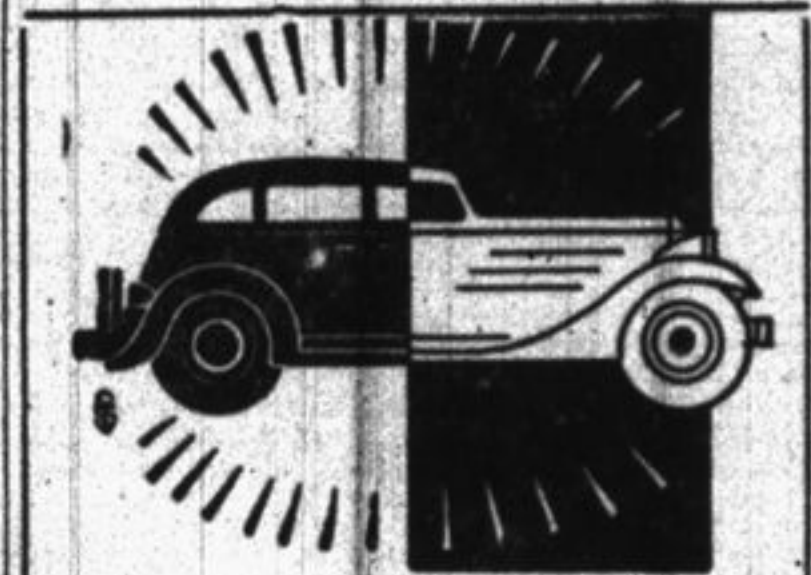
Elmer Elwell Dies In Yedeo, Indiana
