**Highwood Appropriates \$36,220 for Fiscal Year**  
Highwood's appropriation ordinance for the present fiscal year will total \$36,220, which is \$500 less than last year's budget, Mayor E. V. Moccogni announced this week.  
No salaries were changed in any department and for the most part departments were budgeted the same as last year. The street department's budget—\$8200—is higher by \$500 than last year.  
City Attorney Paul Behanna's salary was set at \$500. Other officials' salaries are as follows: the mayor, \$100 a year; city treasurer, \$300; city clerk, \$300; six policeman, \$1000 each; special police, \$500;

chief of police, \$2200.  
Mayor Moccogni warned the city council at a meeting Friday night of last week that with the first three months of the present fiscal year ended, \$9400 has been spent. At that rate the city will not live within its budget, and the mayor cautioned that from now on the aldermen will have to spend only for actual necessities.
