"Invincible Louisa"
The name, Louisa May Alcott, is a familiar one in every home, the name of the author who has written such absorbing and loved stories as "Little Women," "Little Men," "Old Fashioned Girl," etc. Last year many children wept and laughed over the moving picture of the story "Little Women." Besides having a movie made of one of her stories, Miss Alcott was honored in another way last year. Cornelia Meigs, a well-known author of children's books, wrote a biography of her which is called "Invincible Louisa, the story of the Author of Little Women." This book was awarded the Newbery medal for the year 1933. As many of you know, this award is given every year to the author of the most distinguished book for children published in the preceding year. The selection is made and presented by the Ameri-

can Library Association. This is the first time that the award has been given to a book of biography, and we all feel that the life of our favorite author is the only suitable one for such an honor.
Children in Russia
Do you know that children in Russia like to read even better than do children in America? It has been only in the last few years that all Russian children have been able to go to school and to learn to read. And now that they can read, they are very eager to read. The government is kept busy printing new children's books and sometimes they have to stop because they run out of paper. Russian children like stories about things that they see all about them as well as the old classics and folk-tales of their country. The government also publishes for them books from other countries so that they can learn about the world

and about life in foreign lands. They have books by Jules Verne, Charles Dickens and James Fenimore Cooper translated into their language.
The Children's Room of the Public Library has several books by a modern Russian author who writes about things in everyday life.
Marshak, I.I.—Black on White, the story of books; 1000,000 Whys, a trip around the room; What Time Is It?, the story of clocks.

What is meant by the name Dusky Day? No one could be expected to know that Dusky is short for Loduca, a girl's name. Did you ever hear such suggestive and amusing names as Wag-Tail Bess, Tooky and Black Face, all names of picture books? Can you guess what country is meant by Firecracker Land? What is a Pusa and a buckaroo? These words are found in the titles Jerry and the Pusa and Buckaroo. Where can one find The Jumping off Place? Does Toss-up suggest anything to you? Is Silver Boy a boy, or something entirely different? The Fun of It should be fun to read. Paddewings and Ringtail sound like queer creatures. What lies East of the Sun and West of the Moon? Why should one Try All Ports? Ood-le-uk, the Wanderer and Otto of the Silver Hand would, no doubt, be interesting boys

to meet. There are many other names just as interesting; some of them proving that there isn't anything in a name and others proving that the name is everything.
