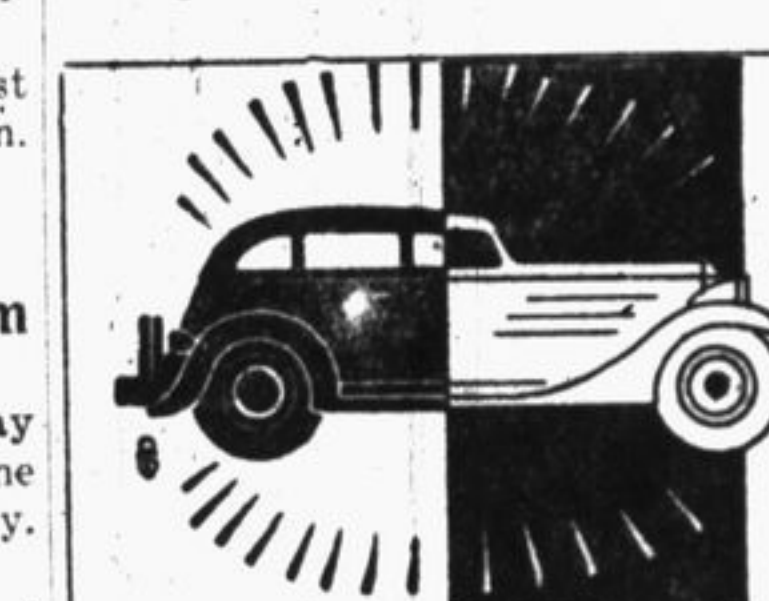
The probable batteries are: Colored stars - Cunningham and King; Boosters - Yearly and Baruffi.

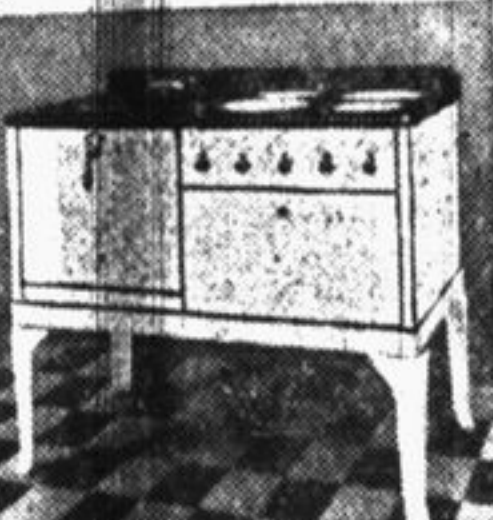
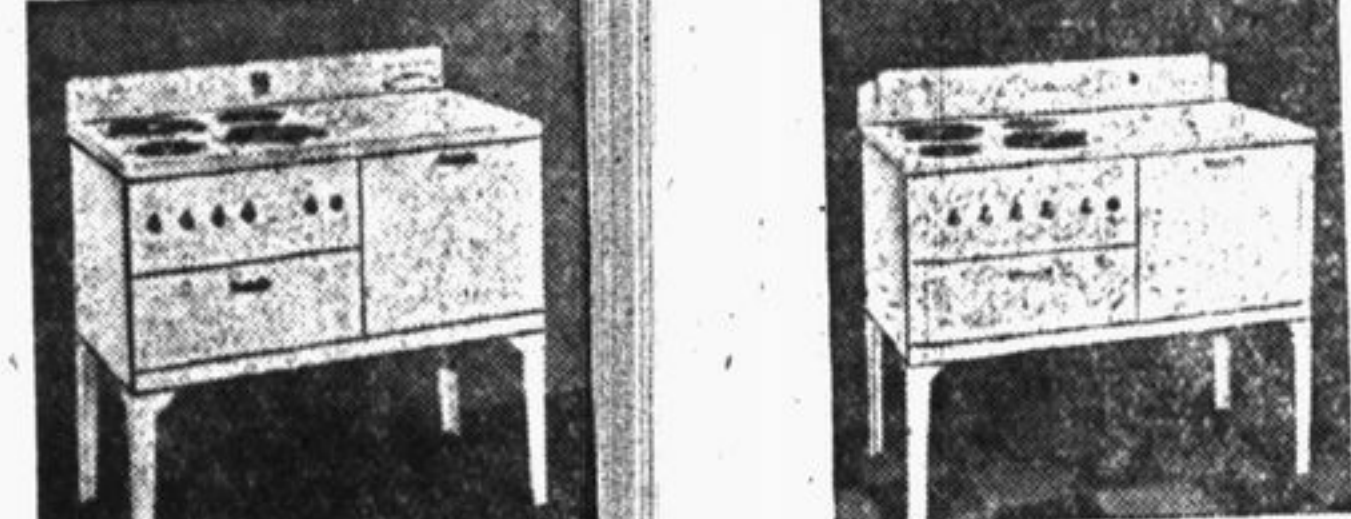

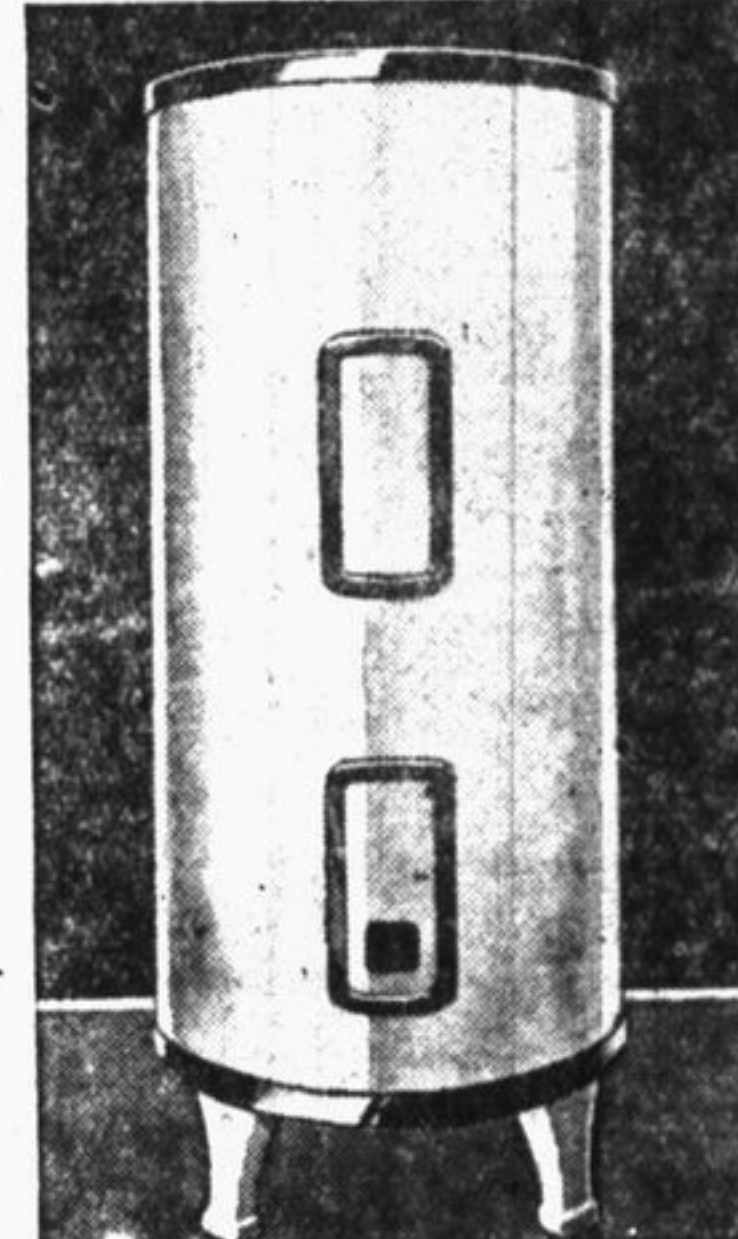
