Pure Oil Company Is Making Improvements Along North Shore

Announcement has been made by the Pure Oil Products Company that activities are already under way in the alterations of newly acquired service stations and in the building of extensive bulk plant facilities in North Shore towns.

Contracts have been let and construction is expected to start about Aug. 1 on the new storage plant and control laboratory on Willow Road at the North Shore Electric Line just west of Winnetka, this location being chosen, according to company officials, because of convenient accessibility to North Shore suburbs. The company has recently added fuel oil distribution throughout the North Shore area to its existing service station facilities in nearly all communities from Evanston to Lake Bluff and this storage plant, together with new truck equipment, will serve its North Shore customers.

According to the plans, this \$100,000 project will consist of two modern buildings and bulk storage facilities for large quantities of all grades of burning oil and gasoline. Near the Willow Road entrance an attractive one story building will house Pure Oil Company's modern control laboratory where the specifications of the various petroleum products will be checked upon arrival from the Company's various refineries. To the rear of this laboratory will be a garage, office and warehouse building of 85,000 square feet ground area. The entire improvement, including loading racks, platforms, driveways and mechanical loading equipment will constitute a complete operating unit according to the company, and will represent an important and much needed distributing operation because of its retail distribution and burning oil gallonage in the North Shore area.

The newly built complete service station improvement is located in Highland Park at the corner of Central Avenue and Green Bay Road, and represents an investment of ap-

proximately \$14,000. This improvement, however, is now ready for operation. The station is one of the largest operated by the company along the North Shore, and, because of its having been recently opened, contains the latest type of equipment and facilities. This property likewise is under lease to the company for a long term of occupancy.

All contracts have been let, the company advises, and local labor and locally acquired materials will be used wherever possible as a part of company policy in an effort to patronize the business interests in the localities in which its operations occur.
