"Just few days ago we found a woman who had gently scraped some old pink wax sweet peas in order to make them look more like real flowers for the summer. The posy of fresh flowers which was sent of her was a pleasant surprise which made her very happy."

The Guild collects fruit, vegetables, jams and jellies as well as flowers. Here again, small contributions are just as acceptable as large ones.

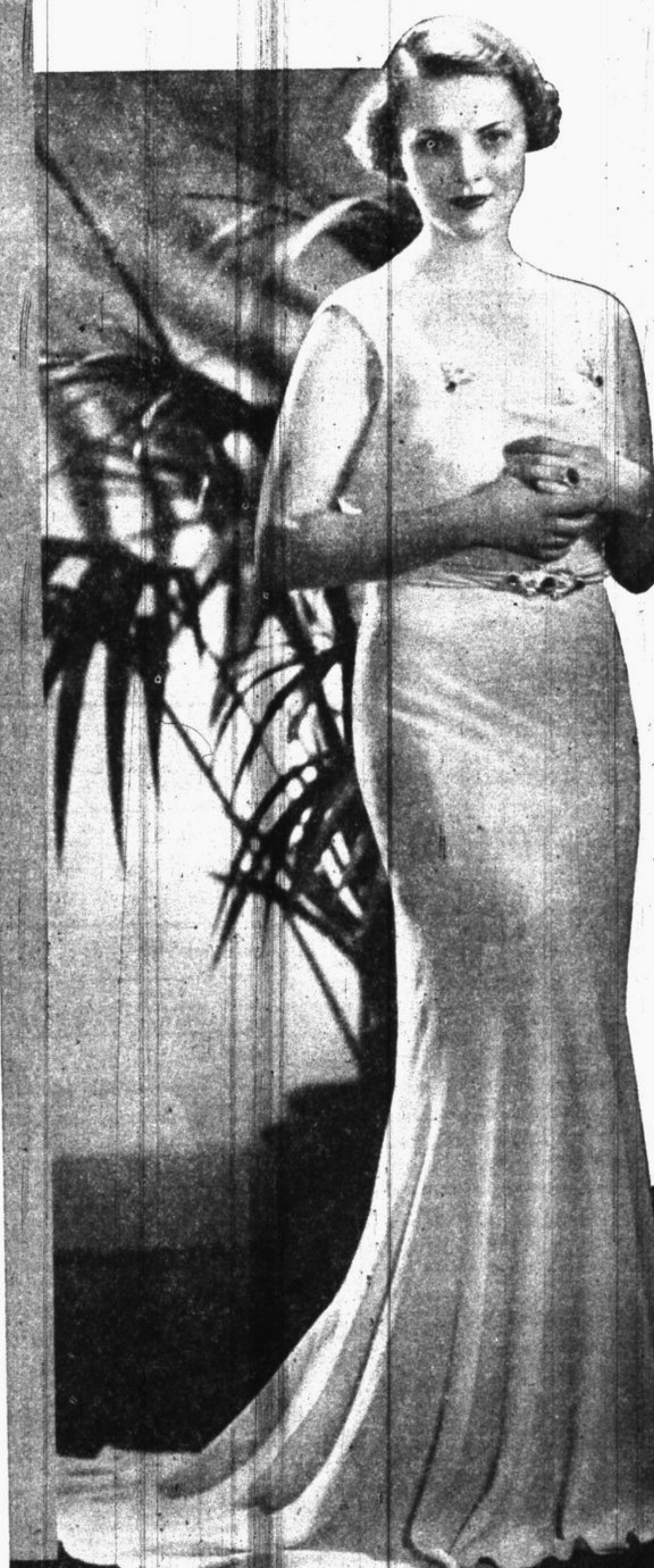
