Dr. Frank Furch, chairman of the Greater North Side Day at the World's Fair, has a committee of prominent artists under the leadership of Fred Biesel and Francis Strain, to pass upon the pulchritude of all entrants in the Greater North Side Day beauty queen contest. The contest will be one of the leading features of the gala North Side Day at the World's Fair, Aug. 23.

Entries are coming in from thousands of North Side girls who think their charms will win them one of the handsome prizes to be awarded the lucky ten leading candidates. Among the numerous prizes for the winner will be a life-sized portrait in oil to be painted by one of Chicago's leading artists.

The finals will take place in the court of honor and the hall of states at the World's Fair where the winner will be crowned amid the plaudits of thousands of northsiders. After the crowning of the queen and her court of nine, they will be escorted by World's Fair officials to several of the largest villages to be guests of the management. On their return from the villages they will be the personal guests of Capt. Harry Rice, commodore of the World's Fair boats who will escort the flagship to the Wilson Company pavilion for a "victory" dinner.
