There were 66 smallpox vaccinations and 56 diphtheria inoculations given. A total of 96 children were given service in one or more of the three forms open.

Only through the able assistance of four local physicians, Dr. Suggden, Dr. Metcalf, Dr. C. J. Davis and Dr. Dorothy Davis, and the two local dentists, Dr. Spriggs and Dr. O'Connell, was it possible for the Auxiliary to render this service to the community, we are told.

The committee, of which Mrs. A. R. Warner was chairman, has received many expressions of gratitude from parents who have taken advantage of this opportunity.

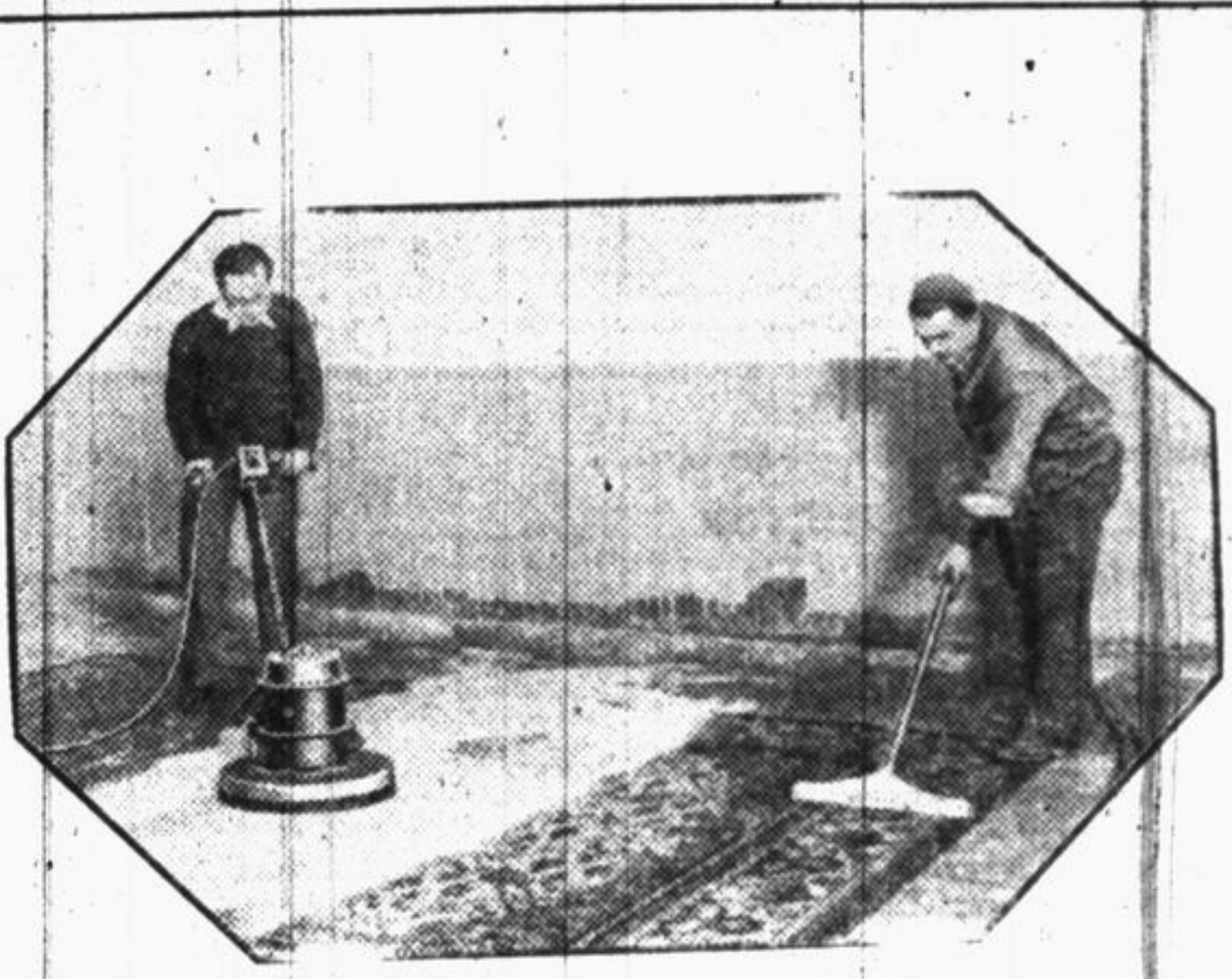
Open Series Of 3 Joint Services
