

Several Important Issues Discussed At Meeting Tuesday

All members of the village board, and the mayor, were present Tuesday evening at an adjourned meeting of the Deerfield Village Board.

The amendment to the liquor ordinance allowing taverns to be open on Sundays from 1 p.m. to 12 midnight was approved, and an ordinance for a tax levy of \$43,810 was passed.

Trustee Ralph Peterson reported that twenty automobile licenses and two truck licenses were still uncollected and that a report of the dog licenses would be complete on Sept. 1. Kennels are also to be taxed.

Trustee M. A. Pottenger reported that the septic tank at the west ditch had been repaired, two manholes and two inlets had been replaced there for observation purposes.

The village relief projects have been turned down by the state, but the board will make another plea for help.

The state motor fuel tax allotment for Deerfield in June was \$314.40 for the upkeep of Deerfield's arterial highways.

A request was made for street lights on County Line and Wilmot Roads, as per ordinance which calls for one light for every 400 feet.

Telephone Issue The greater part of the evening was spent in the discussion of a petition presented by the Deerfield Woman's Club, asking for free telephone rates between Highland Park and Deerfield.

When this information is compiled a petition for appraisal and audit will be sent by the board to the Interstate Commerce Commission.

It is expected that all details will be arranged so that the telephone question can be acted upon at the next meeting of the village board, which will be Tuesday evening, September 4th.
