## News of Other Communities

Suit asking \$120,590 from Attorney Oscar D. Stern, of Chicago, allegedly for non-payment of a loan, was filed Tuesday in circuit court in Cook County in behalf of Mrs. Dorothy Patterson Santini, of New York City, former wife of Col. Noble Brandon Judah, Lake Forest and Chicago, attorney and former ambassador to Cuba.

The suit alleges that Mrs. Santini loaned Mr. Stern \$98,790, of which only \$2595 has been paid. The suit asks that judgment for the loan, plus 8 per cent interest, be accorded Mrs. Santini. Mr. Stern is a member of the law firm of Judah, Reichman, Trumbull, Cox and Stern.

The United States Civil Service Commission announces an open competitive examination to fill the position of postmaster at Lake Bluff and Fort Sheridan, which positions will become vacant this year. Both are third class postoffices.

The Lake Bluff position pays \$2,100 per year, and the Fort Sheridan office pays \$2300 per year.

Applications for these positions must be filed with the United States Civil Service Commission, in Washington, D.C., by Sept. 7, 1934. Form 10 and Form 2223, containing full information as to the requirements to be met and the character of the examination to be given may be obtained from the Lake Bluff or Fort Sheridan postoffices, or from the United States Civil Service Commission.

The date for the examination for the two positions, which will be held at Lake Forest and Grays Lake, will be stated on the admission cards sent applicants after the date for the close of receipt of applications, and will be about fifteen days after that date.

The children have had a good season on the playgrounds, and a full report will appear later in the Lake Forester.

There has been a big increase in population at the West Chicago Stock Yards of the Chicago & North Western Railway during the last month.

This yard, located 30 miles west of Chicago, near the North Western main line, which normally handles a few hundred head of cattle and sheep every day shipped in from points in the railroad's territory, has about 28,000 head of cattle on hand at the present time due to the heavy movement of relief cattle into Chicago from the Dakotas, Nebraska, Wyoming and Montana, shipped by the United States Government.

The population is a shifting one, with as many as 200 or 300 carloads a day coming into the yards and an equal number going out either to eastern grazing fields or to the packers.

This heavy movement started about 30 days ago as a result of the Federal program of cattle reduction and relief. West Chicago, because of its ample facilities, was chosen as one of the three yards to be used as clearing points. There may be as many as 5 million head of cattle clear through these three yards before the program is completed. So far there have been about 150,000 head brought into West Chicago, all handled quickly and efficiently without taxing the capacity of the yard.

The layout at West Chicago permits the handling of enormous shipments of cattle. The Chicago & Northwestern Railway owns 1700 acres in addition to the enclosed sheep and cattle pens at the yards, excellent land for grazing. The yard is operated for the railway by Marshall Brothers. It is known as one of the largest and most modern feeding yards in the country.

At a recent meeting held at the home of Robert N. McCreary, 397 North Washington Road, a group of Lake Forest voters organized a new political club which has been named the Lake Forest Democratic Club.

The call for the meeting was issued by the local Democratic committee. With Paul E. Brady acting as temporary chairman, a constitution was drawn up and adopted.

The following officers were unanimously elected: Robert N. McCreary, president; Mrs. Carter Harrison Jr., first vice-president; Edward Baldwin, second vice-president; Paul E. Brady, secretary; Frank P. Dewey, treasurer.

The purpose of the organization is, primarily, to further the best interests of the Democratic party in the City of Lake Forest. Since it has the active support of the party leaders, it will undoubtedly become the center of increased Democratic activity in this community.

Plans were inaugurated for regular meetings at which prominent speakers will attend, and at which political and civic questions will be debated. The president appointed an executive committee of seven members to make all arrangements. There are no membership dues, but each member is required to sign a pledge.

Mr. McCreary said, "The tremendous increase in Democratic voters has necessitated the forming of local clubs all over Lake County. We expect to have over 200 active members by our next meeting, which will be held Monday evening, Aug. 27, at the Young Men's Club. Any person who desires to attend is welcome."
