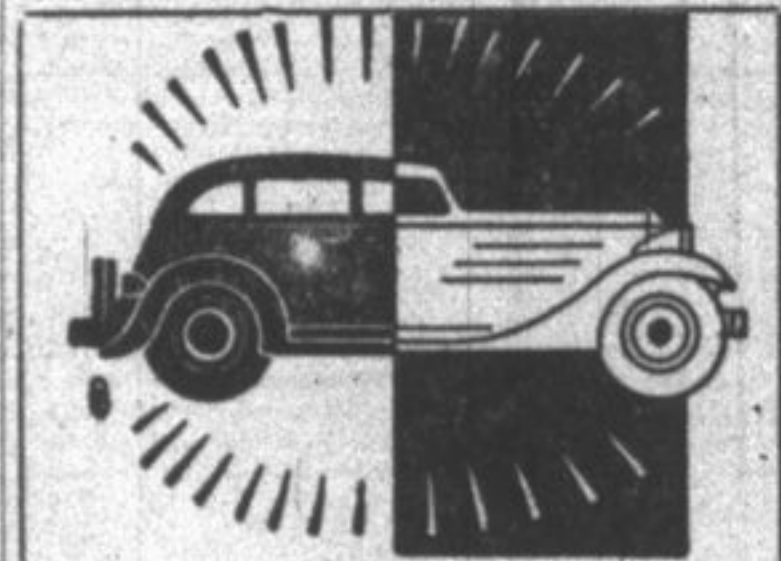
Service Men Must Apply For Benefits Before Jan. 2, 1935

All veterans of the World War who by such service, are eligible for benefits under the adjusted compensation act. L. R. Benston, Department Service Officer of the American Legion has issued a warning that the final date on which they may apply for these benefits will expire on Jan. 2, 1935. This same date effects the surviving dependents of World War Veterans; widow, children, mother and father, in the order named. If the veteran died without making application, his surviving dependents must complete their claim before Jan. 2, 1935.

Service officers of local posts may be depended upon to assist veterans or their heirs in making these applications.
