Field Museum Lectures

Beginning Saturday, Oct. 6, and continuing through October and November, the Field Museum of Natural History, Chicago, will present its sixty-second course of free lectures on travel and science, illustrated with motion pictures and stereopticon slides. There will be eight lectures in all, given on Saturday afternoon at 3 o'clock, in the James Simpson Theatre of the museum. Admission is free and no tickets are required. These lectures are for adults only. For children special moving pictures are provided at the museum on Saturday mornings. While a portion of the seats in the theatre is reserved for members of the museum attending the lectures, the larger part will be available to the general public, which is cordially invited to attend. Well-known explorers and naturalists have been engaged for the series, and a wide range of subjects will be covered. A feature of the series will be the program of Nov. 3, when instead of a lecture there will be presented "The Human Adventure," notable talking picture produced by the Oriental Institute of the University of Chicago in which man's rise from savagery to civilization is traced.

Lectures For Children

The James Nelson and Anna Louise Raymond Foundation for Public School and Children's Lectures announced today its annual autumn series of free motion picture programs for children, to be given at the Field Museum of Natural History, Chicago. These entertainments, nine in number, will be presented on Saturday mornings, beginning on Oct. 6 and ending on Dec. 1. They will be given in the James Simpson Theatre of the museum. Twenty-nine films, in all, will be shown, with a wide variety of subject matter ranging from wild animals to events in American history, and travel in far places to interesting facts about great industries. The theatre of the museum provides accommodations for several thousand children each Saturday, as all programs will be given twice, one showing beginning at 10 a.m., and another at 11. Children from all parts of Chicago and suburbs are invited to attend. They may come alone, in groups from schools and other centers, or with their parents, teachers or other adults. Admission is free.
