

State Police Asked for Fast Skokie Highway

A special patrol of state motorcycle policemen to "crack down" on reckless drivers along the new Skokie highway is the North Shore District Planning Commission's proposed remedy for traffic conditions which have resulted in numerous fatal accidents.

The request for a special police patrol was forwarded last week in the Winnetka Village Hall.

Although the state highway department was reported to be making progress with a traffic count designed to lead eventually to the installation of stop and go lights at important intersections of the road, it was pointed out that the installation of the lights will do little good if there are not police enough on the highway to enforce the regulations.

In support of this argument members cited the high rates of speed found to be prevalent on the highway in a survey conducted by North Shore village officials, which showed that nine out of ten cars were traveling more than 40 miles per hour, and some as high as 85 miles per hour.

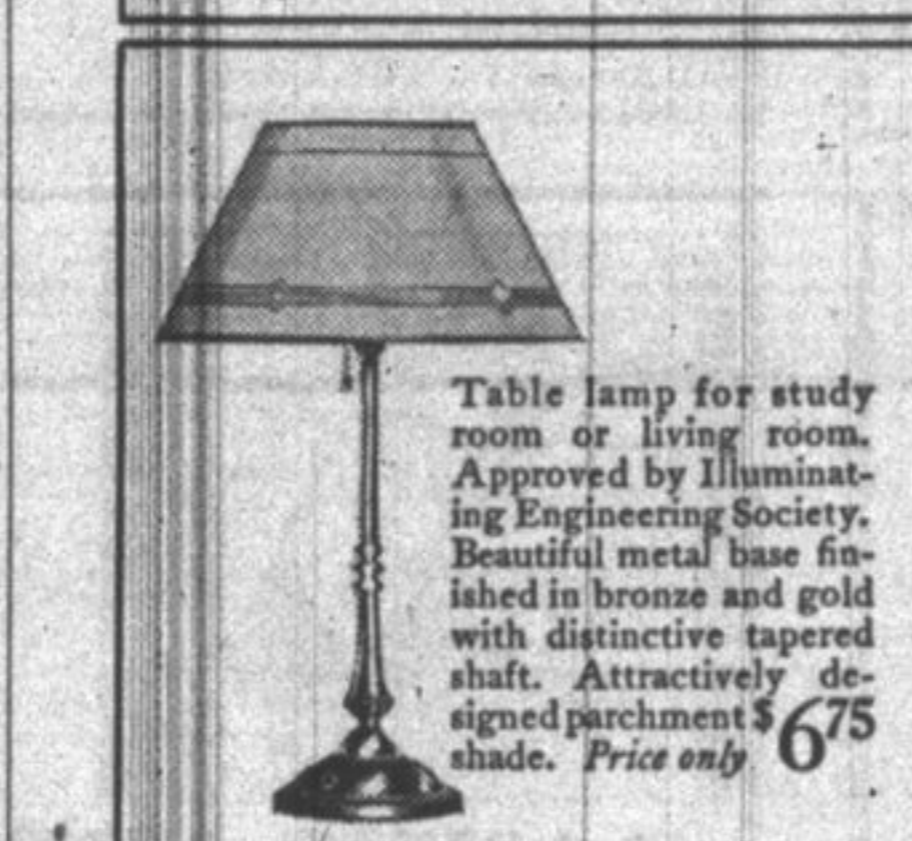
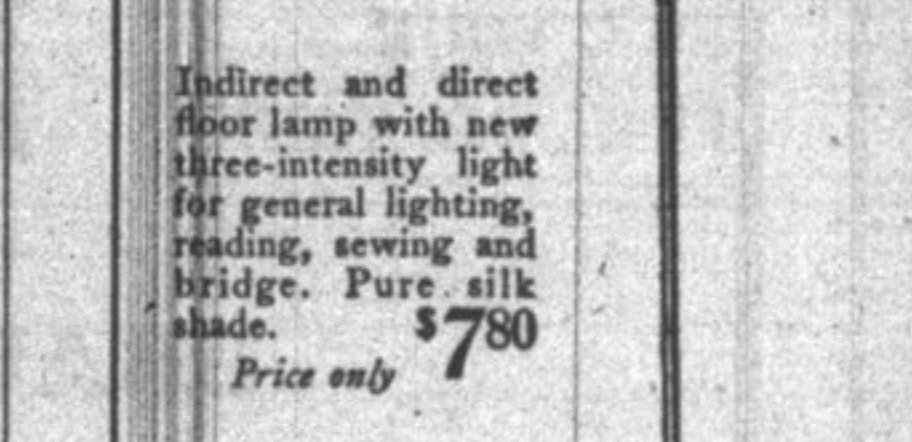
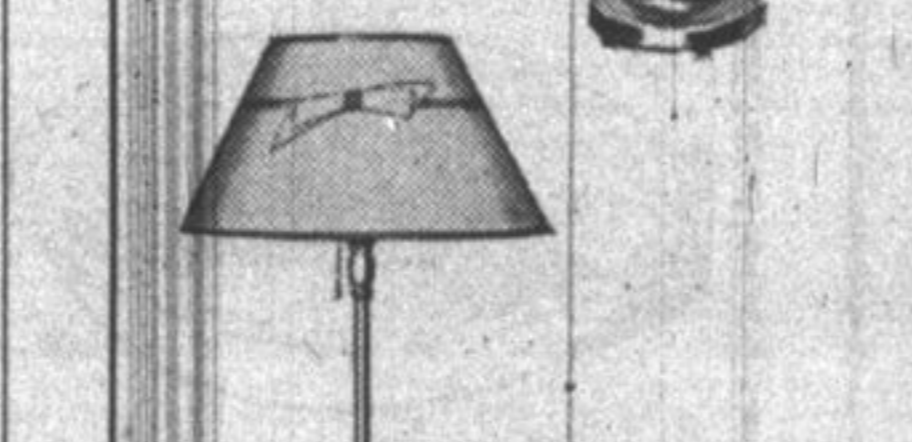
