Democratic Rallies Attract Many People

About 10,000 people have attended Democratic rallies held in various sections of the county since October 1, according to attendance reports turned into the campaign committee of the Lake County Democratic Central committee.

With the exception of the Waukegan rally in the township high school, Wednesday, Oct. 17, which broke all attendance records for political rallies in that city with more than 1,500 people, the majority of the crowds have gathered in various communities in western Lake county, the figures show.

Michael L. Igoe, Democratic candidate for congress-at-large, was the leading spokesman at the Waukegan high school rally where he explained the Republican position in the current campaign.

Martin A. Brennan, Mr. Igoe's running mate, pointed out that the new deal was the "first time that any administration in history has cast its eyes west of the Alleghenies to do something for the farmer."

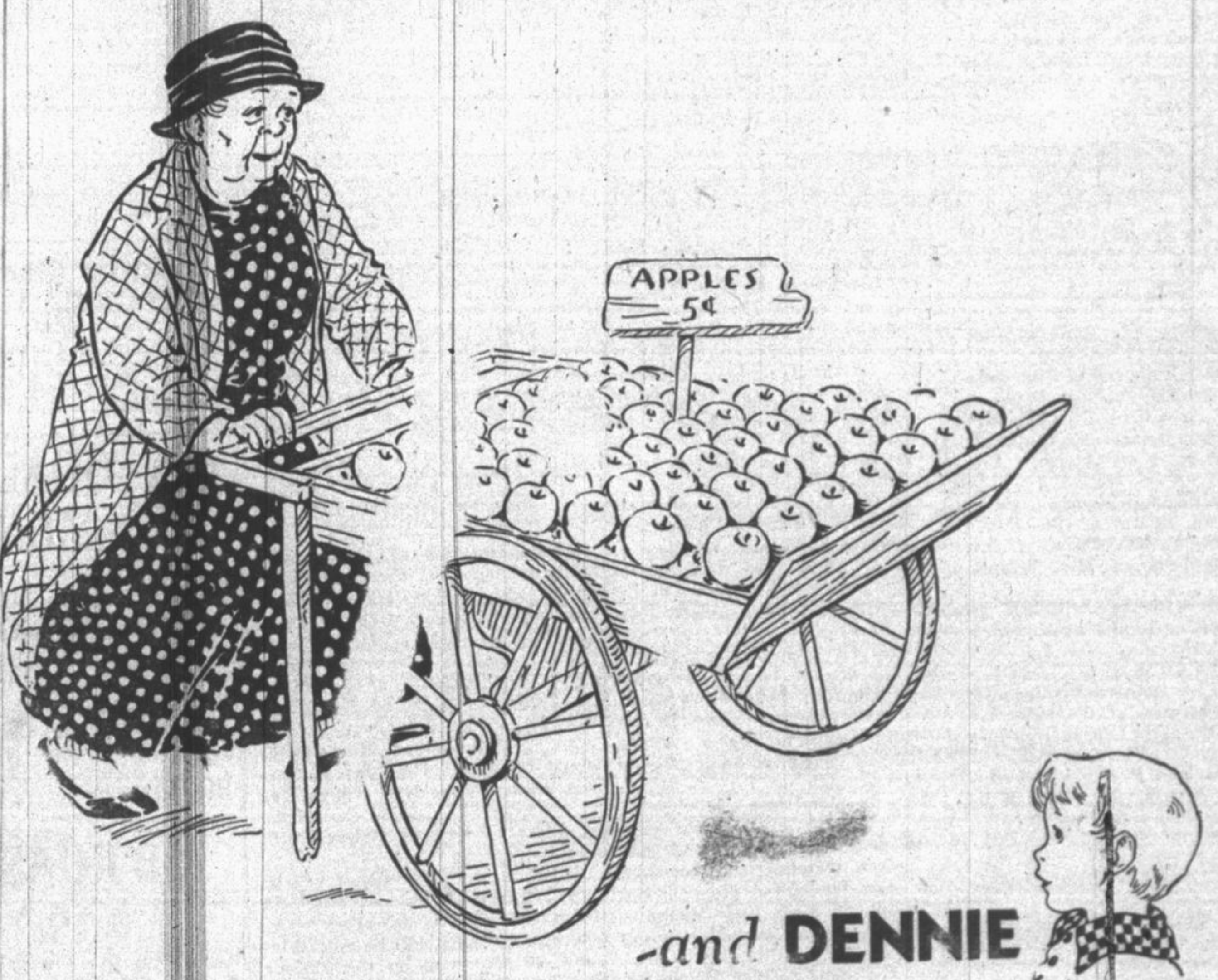
