"Salome" at the Grand Opera House on Nov. 28

Richard Strauss' "Salome" will be revised by the Chicago Grand Opera Company Wednesday night, Nov. 28, with Maria Jeritza in the title role. Isaac VanGrove, stage-director of the company, will conduct. Following "Salome," the first act of "Pagliacci" will be sung, with Carlo Morelli, who made such a success as Di Luna in Wednesday night's revival of "Il Trovatore," as Tonio—a role in which he has high celebrity in Italy. Leoncavallo, himself, is quoted as calling Morelli's Tonio "the character as I had it in mind when I wrote the opera." As Leoncavallo was his own librettist in the case of this opera, the quoted statement may be regarded as high praise. Morelli was the Amosasco of the "Aida" revival, Tuesday of this week, and Don Carlo in "La Forza del Destino," which will be sung Saturday night, Nov. 24, with Somigli and Martinelli.

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE ISSUANCE OF PARK BONDS OF THE HIGHLAND PARK EAST PARK DISTRICT IN THE SUM OF THIRTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$30,000.00) AND PROVIDING FOR THE PAYMENT THEREOF.

WHEREAS, The Highland Park East Park District is a duly organized Park District under the laws of the State of Illinois, and is charged with the duty of acquiring and maintaining a public park or parks in said district; and

WHEREAS, It is necessary, for the purpose of providing funds for the payment of land condemned or purchased for parks or boulevards, and for the building, maintaining, improving and protecting of the same, and for the payment of the expenses incident thereto, that there be borrowed Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$30,000.00) and that bonds be issued therefor.

NOW, THEREFORE, for the purpose of providing funds with which to pay the price of such lands, improvements and the maintenance thereof,

Be it Ordained by the Board of Park Commissioners of The Highland Park East Park District, of Lake County, Illinois:

Section 1. That there shall be and there are hereby directed to be issued Thirty (30) Park Bonds of this District of the denomination of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) each, to be dated November 15, 1934, all bearing interest at the rate of Four Per Cent (4%), payable semi-annually, such interest to be evidenced by interest coupons attached to said bonds, respectively.

Said bonds shall be numbered from One (1) to Thirty (30), respectively, and shall mature as follows:

Both principal and interest of said bonds shall be payable at The Highland Park State Bank, Highland Park, Illinois. Said bonds shall be signed by the President and Treasurer of the Board of Commissioners and countersigned by its Secretary with his seal of office affixed.

Section 2. Except as to number, said bonds and coupons shall be in substantially the following form:

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, that The Highland Park East Park District, in the County of Lake and State of Illinois, a park district legally created and existing under the laws of the State of Illinois, acknowledges itself to owe, and for value received hereby promises to pay to bearer One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) lawful money of the United States, on the _____ day of November, 19____.

This bond is one of a series of bonds of like date, tenor and maturity, issued for the purpose of providing funds for the payment of land condemned or purchased for parks or boulevards, for building, maintaining, improving and protecting the same, and for the payment of the expenses incident thereto in and for said District under the authority of an Act of the General Assembly of the State of Illinois, entitled, "An Act to provide for the organization of park districts and the transfer of submerged lands to those districts on navigable bodies of water," approved June 24, 1895, and the several amendments thereof.

And it is hereby certified and recited that all acts, conditions and things required to be done precedent to and in the organization of the Highland Park East Park District, in and in the issuing of this bond have been done, happened, and been performed in regular and due form and seasonably required by law; that a continuing direct annual tax has been levied upon all the taxable property in said The Highland Park East Park District for the payment of the principal and interest of this bond; that the total indebtedness of said The Highland Park East Park District, this bond included, does not exceed any constitutional or statutory limitations.

For the prompt payment of this bond, both principal and interest, at maturity, as aforesaid, the full faith, credit and resources of said Park District are hereby irrevocably pledged.

This bond is subject to registration as principal in the name of the holder upon the books of the Treasurer of said Park District, such registration to be evidenced by notation of said Treasurer on the back hereof. After such registration, no transfer hereof, except upon such books and similarly noted hereon, shall be valid unless the last registration shall have been to bearer.

Registration hereof shall not affect negotiability of the coupons hereto attached, which shall continue transferable by delivery merely notwithstanding registration hereof.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, The Highland Park East Park District, acting by its Board of Park Commissioners, has caused this bond to be signed by the President and Treasurer and attested and countersigned by the Secretary of its Board of Commissioners, with their official seals, and has caused the annexed interest coupons to be executed with the lithographed facsimile signature of said officers, this fifteenth day of November, A.D. 1934.

Section 5. That a certified copy of this ordinance be filed in the office of the County Clerk of Lake County, Illinois, and such Clerk shall annually compute the rate necessary to produce the foregoing sums in the foregoing years.

Section 6. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication.
