

**Postmaster Gives Advice on Christmas Mailing**

Beginning Wednesday, December 19 and continuing until Monday, December 24, the Highland Park postoffice will be open evenings until 8 p.m. for the convenience of patrons, according to an announcement by Hugo L. Schneider, Postmaster.

Mr. Schneider also gives the following advice concerning the preparing and mailing of packages and greeting cards:

Christmas greeting cards when enclosed in unsealed envelopes may be sent for 1 1/2 cents, but these cards cannot be forwarded to another post office, without additional postage.

During the holiday time the volume of mail increases approximately 200 per cent. It is a physical impossibility to handle this great mass of mail matter efficiently and promptly within a few days. Therefore to assure delivery of their Christmas presents, cards, and letters by Christmas Day the public should SHOP AND MAIL EARLY.

Do your Christmas shopping so that you can mail your gifts, greetings, and letters to relatives, friends, and loved ones at least a week or 10 days before Christmas, according to the distance. This will not only make it certain that they are received before Christmas Day, but will be a great aid to your postal service and to postal employees and enable them to spend the Christmas holiday with their families.

All parcels must be securely packed and wrapped. Use strong paper and heavy twine.

Cut flowers: Place in strong suitable boxes of wood, tin, or heavy corrugated cardboard. Wrap with tissue to retain moisture.

Candies: Enclose a strong outside boxes or containers.

Drawings, paintings, unmounted maps, etc.: Pack or wrap in strong material to avoid damage. When not flat, roll around a wooden core and then wrap and tie carefully or place in strong pasteboard tube.

Sharp-pointed or sharp-edged instruments or tools must have points and edges fully guarded to prevent injury to clerks in handling or damage to other mail. Crate suitably or thoroughly wrap so that they cannot cut through the wrapping.

Articles easily broken or crushed must be securely packed and crated or boxed. Use liberal quantities of excelsior, or like material, in, around and between the articles and the outside container.

Glassware, fragile toys, or crockery must be packed so as to prevent the escape of particles or pieces if broken in transit.

Cigars: Ordinary boxes of cigars wrapped in paper only will not be accepted. Pack in a manner to prevent damage by shock or jar. Wrap in corrugated pasteboard or similar material. Cigars must be in good shipping condition.

All articles easily broken or damaged must be plainly marked "FRAGILE."

Parcels containing perishable articles shall be marked "Perishable" and packed in suitable container, according to contents. Articles likely to spoil within the time reasonably required for transportation and delivery will not be accepted for mailing.

Use special-delivery stamps to expedite delivery. Addresses should be complete, with house number and the name of street, post-office box, or rural-route number, and typed or plainly written in ink. A return card should be placed in the upper left corner of every piece of mail. If a tag is used, the address and return card should also be written on the wrapper for use if tag is lost, and a copy of the address should be enclosed inside the parcel. Do not mail Christmas greeting cards in red, green, or other dark colored envelopes, or in very small envelopes.

Mail parcels to reach destination not later than Monday morning, Dec. 24, 1934. Follow the schedule shown below to secure best handling although parcels may be mailed to any address on any date:

Pacific Coast States — Washington, Oregon, California, Nevada, Idaho, Dec. 15 to 17.

Western States — Montana Wyoming, Utah, Dec. 16 to 19.

South Western States — Arizona, New Mexico, Oklahoma, Texas, Dec. 16 to 19.

Near Western States — North

Dakota, South Dakota, Nebraska, Kansas, Colorado, Dec. 17 to 20.

Southern States — Arkansas, Tennessee, Louisiana, Mississippi, Alabama, Georgia, Florida, Virginia, West Virginia, North Carolina and South Carolina, Dec. 17 to 20.

Eastern States — New York, Delaware, Pennsylvania, Maryland and New Jersey, Dec. 17 to 20.

Neighboring States — Minnesota, Iowa, Missouri, Wisconsin, Indiana, Michigan, Ohio, Kentucky, Dec. 18 to 20.

Local State — Illinois for Illinois offices, Dec. 20 to 21.

**IMPORTANT ANNOUNCEMENT REGARDING RETAILERS' OCCUPATION TAX**

The State Department of Finance has, effective December 10, 1934, so changed the regulations governing the pricing of merchandise under the Illinois Retailers' Occupation Tax Act, that all retailers are now permitted to price merchandise so that this item may be shown separately. Henceforth this will be accomplished at the time of purchase, in accordance with the following schedule:

- On purchases from 1c to 18c inclusive, nothing additional.
- On purchases from 19c to 65c inclusive, 1c additional.
- On purchases from 66c to \$1.24 inclusive, 2c additional.
- On purchases of \$1.25 and over, 2% additional.
