**1935 Automobile Show**  
To Open January 26

Chicago, Jan 2—Deviating sharply in nearly every respect from all preceding expositions of its kind, here or elsewhere, the thirty-fifth annual Chicago Automobile Show will be held at the Coliseum during the week of Jan. 26 to Feb. 2.

Besides representing an entirely new conception in point of decorative and illuminating style, the forthcoming show will display cars differently and more effectively. In addition, it will mark the first time that all makes of cars have been displayed at an automobile show here, and due to the elimination of special hotel displays which have been held in the past, the entire show for the first time in many years will be held entirely under one roof.

Preparations have been going forward during the past six months under direction of the show committee, which consists of H. T. Hollingshead, Nash-LaFayette, chairman; M. J. Lanahan, Dodge-Plymouth, and an ex-officio member by reason of being president of the Chicago Automobile Trade Association; V. C. P. Dreiske, Cadillac-LaSalle; Harry Lewis, Chevrolet; F. M. Miller, Buick, and J. J. Wright, Ford.

Operating under the supervision of the committee is A. C. Fach, show manager who has staged many spectacular expositions, and J. C. Becker, noted scenic artist, who is guiding the designing and construction of the brilliant effects, which will cost more than \$40,000.

The interior of the Coliseum and its adjoining halls to the south and north will be done entirely in a color scheme of gold and black. This applies alike to the ceiling, sides, floors and the exhibit spaces themselves.

Massiveness will be combined with beauty in the ensemble, which is to be featured by such eye catchers as a jeweled automobile at the intersection of the main aisles and 12 feet above the ground; two 43-foot giant goddesses, one at each end, holding in their laps full sized motor cars, and 14 giant figures towering 32 feet skyward, each holding a component part of an automobile, such as engine, battery, starter, radiator, tire, axle, transmission, and so on.

Ingenious use of spotlighting will throw the illumination upon the jeweled car, the automobiles held by the goddesses and the units carried by the other giant figures.

The idea behind the entire scheme is described as a fitting method of showing the giant proportions of the automotive industry, its leadership among the world's industries, and the dominance of the motor car in the life of America.

Another departure will be the displaying of car insignia and names not only above the various booths but also in the flooring. In this connection, too, there will be a "Stop-go" effect to attract visitors to the exhibits.

The phase of illumination represents one of the greatest advancements as compared with previous shows held throughout the country in past years. The modernistic motif will prevail, with lights thrown on the cars and featured figures, where it is agreed they belong, instead of on the ceiling, as heretofore.

The chandeliers which drew the

visitor's eyes toward the ceiling as he entered the Coliseum have been abandoned for the 1935 edition of Chicago's show. In their stead, the ceiling will simulate a night effect, with myriads of twinkling stars.

On display, and all of them occupying the ground floor, will be the following makes of motor cars: Auburn, Buick, Cadillac, Chevrolet, Chrysler, De Soto, Duesenberg, Dodge, Ford, Graham, Hudson, Hupmobile, LaFayette, LaSalle, Lincoln, Nash, Oldsmobile, Packard, Pierce-Arrow, Plymouth, Pontiac, Reo, Studebaker, Terraplane, and several "surprise" makes by these manufacturers. The second floor is to be devoted to the exhibit of the newest in parts, accessories and other devices of interest to the motorist.

In every detail, real showmanship is to be merged with a setting which has made those in charge of the show confident that it will set a new high mark in attendance.
