John Condon Jr. is very ill with a kidney infection.

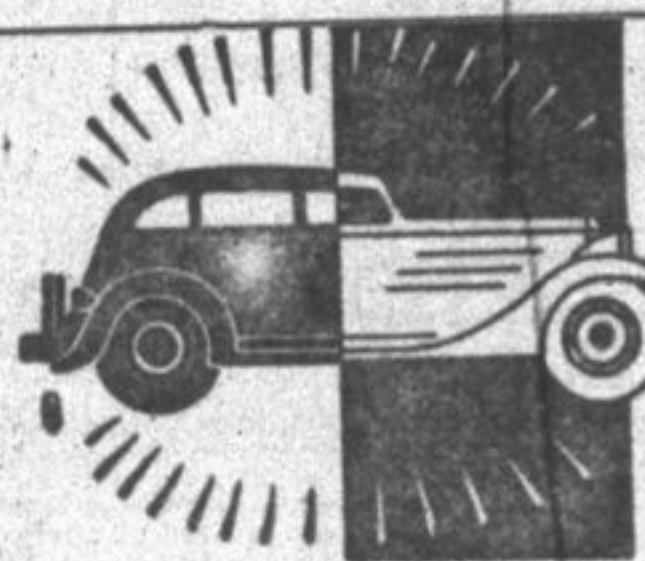
Mr. and Mrs. Harry Wing returned Friday from a fortnight's sojourn in Florida and other southern cities.

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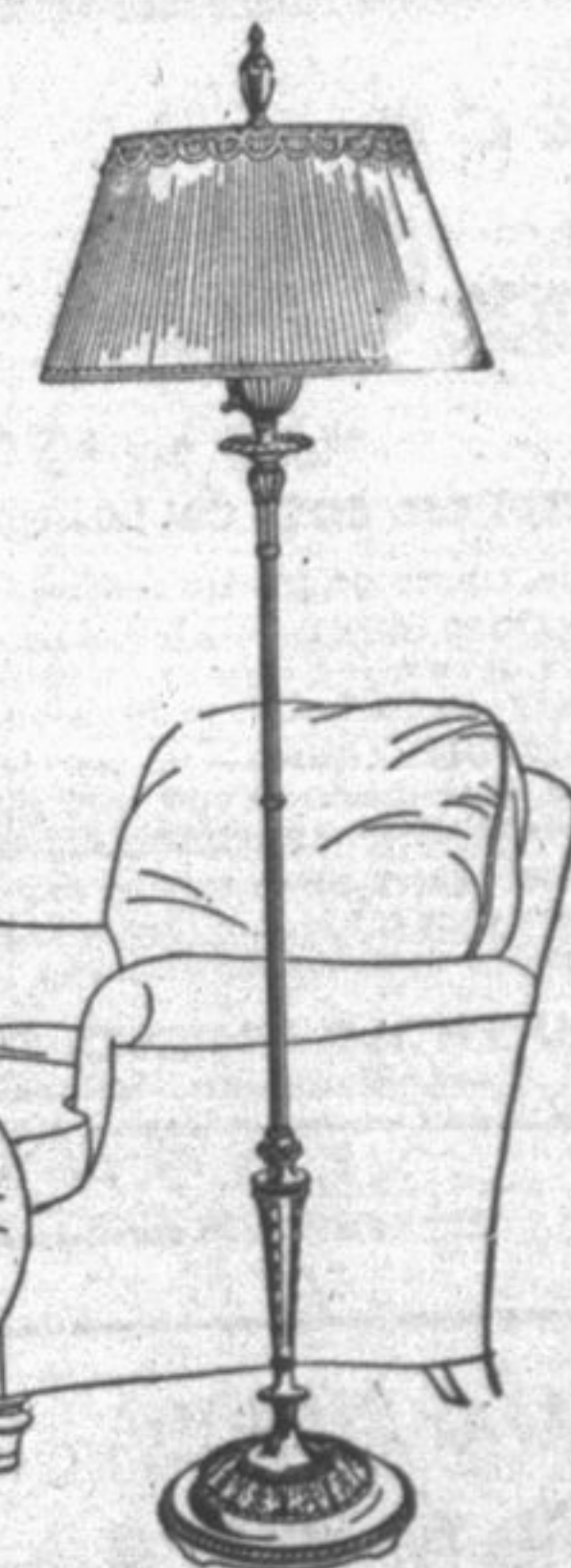
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
