ander was the son of Col. and Mrs. James M. Alexander. He came north with his parents as a boy and attended school at Paris, Ill. About 1880 he came to Chicago and engaged in the insurance business.

Surviving Mr. Alexander are his widow, Mrs. Maud Greene Alexander, to whom he was married in 1896, and two brothers, F. B. of Los Angeles, Cal., and Harry E. of Chicago.

The body will arrive here this morning (Thursday) from Florida. Services which will be held Saturday afternoon at 2:30 at the Presbyterian Church, will be conducted by the Rev. Frank Pitt of Detroit, Mich., former pastor of the local church.

The following information concerning Mr. Alexander, was contributed by his business partner, J. A. G. Preus, of 319 North Sheridan Road, who besides being associated with Mr. Alexander in business, has been his friend and neighbor for many years.

W. A. Alexander, founder of W. A. Alexander & Co., one of Chicago's oldest and largest insurance agencies, being located for over 50 years on the corner of LaSalle and Adams streets, has just passed away. He was to have celebrated the moving of his great organization to the 33rd, 34th and 35th floors of the new Field building at LaSalle and Adams Streets.

Aside from his business, Highland Park has been interested in him as a resident since 1891 at 304 North Sheridan Road. He will be missed by young and old on the North Shore. Mr. Alexander made a great contribution to the beauty of the North Shore. He was the original president of Exmoor Country Club, an initial director, owned the land which was sold at a nominal figure to the Club and died an honorary member thereof. He had much to do with the organization of Bob O'Link and Sunset Valley and was an honorary member of both of them at the time of his death. Old Elm, he and a friend promoted and organized and made it the outstanding men's club in this area. He was a member of Onwentsia for many years. His great hobby was golf. These golf courses constitute a great park system of the entire area from Ravinia to Lake Forest to be enjoyed by coming generations either as golf courses or a park system. He won a great many trophies at the game which he loved. He was a member of the Western Golf Association and also at one time first vice-president of the United States Golf Association. Fortunately, Mrs. Alexander who survives him, has for a great many years been an outstanding golfer.

As an entertainer in his home he was a most congenial host and beloved by all who had the privilege of meeting him there.

By virtue of this victory Deerfield again jumped into a three way tie for the league leadership as Oak Park was humbled by the fifth place New Trier aggregation. Between them Hansen and Dean scored 26 of their team's total points. These two boys seemed unstoppable as they sank shots from every conceivable angle. As a whole the team played a very aggressive game intercepting innumerable passes which resulted in points for the local team.

However, the local lightweight team did not fare as well as their larger team mates. The Proviso pony team completely routed the Deerfield team with the final count being 25 to 20 in their favor.

On Friday evening of this week both Deerfield teams will travel to Waukegan where they engage a fast improving Gold and Purple quintet. Due to the fact that Captain Hansen will not be available to the heavyweight team the Waukeganites are given almost an even chance of winning. The Waukegan team is now in fourth place behind Deerfield, Oak Park and Evanston.

Deerfield Begins Clean-Up Month

The village has been divided into four sections and the campaign is covering a period of sixteen days beginning Monday, Feb. 11 and concluding on Thursday, Feb. 28. The north-west part is called Section 1; north-east is Section 2; south-west is Section 3 and south-east is Section 4.

The schedule is:
Section 1—Feb. 11 to 15
On Deerfield avenue, from Chestnut street west to Spruce street, north to Greenwood and Woodland park.
Section 2—Feb. 16 to 20
On Deerfield avenue from Park avenue to east limits, north to Point Comfort.
Section 3—Feb. 21 to 25
South of Deerfield avenue to Central avenue, east to South Elm street.
Section 4—Feb. 26 to 28
South of Deerfield avenue, East of Railroad tracks to Brierhill road, and south to County Line road.
