Local Woman To Speak In Washington

In the debate on the Lucretia Mott amendment to the constitution, proposing legal rights for women equal to those for men, a feature of the first conference session of the League of Women Voters, opening at 10 o'clock on the 26th, Mrs. Raymond S. Simons of Highland Park will take the negative. Mrs. Simons, chairman of the legal status committee of the Illinois League of Women Voters, which is waging an active fight against the amendment, is replacing Miss Agnes Nestor, who is required to be in Washington, D.C., the 26th for a labor conference.

Mrs. Simons has as her opponent Mrs. Burnita Shelton Matthews of Washington, president of the National Association of Women Lawyers.

WILLIAM F. HOGAN DIES WEDNESDAY A. M.

Was Prominent in Political Circles; Served as Highwood Mayor 25 Years

William F. Hogan, 82, died at his home, 9 Walker avenue, yesterday morning Wednesday, at 6:52 a.m. He was engaged in the real estate business at the time of his death and had been active in the field for many years.

He was born in Albany, New York, in 1852. He had been a resident of Highwood for about 50 years, during which time he filled the office of mayor over a period of 25 years.

He was a member of the Modern Woodmen and the Odd Fellows and for many years was considered a strong political power in the state. He is survived by three nephews and three nieces of Albany, and one nephew, John Crowley, of Highwood.

Funeral services will be held Saturday morning at 9:30 in the St. James church in Highwood, with interment in St. Mary's cemetery in Lake Forest. The body will be at the Kelley funeral parlors until Saturday morning.
