

This Week in Washington

Washington, D. C., Feb. 16—Bids on the new post office for Wilmette were received by the Post Office Department on the 4th of this month.

Rivalries between committees in the House of Representatives are not uncommon, with bitter quarrels between the respective chairmen as to whether their particular committee should have jurisdiction over a major bill.

Sam Rayburn, Democrat, of Texas, chairman of the Committee on Interstate and Foreign Commerce, is in a dispute with Schuler Otis Bland, Democrat, of Virginia, chairman of the Committee on Merchant Marine, Radio and Fisheries, as to which of these committees should be assigned legislation involving communications by radio, wireless, telegraph, cables and telephones.

The Ways and Means Committee has concluded its hearings on the Economic Security measure. Agreement has not yet been reached by the committee on the old-age pension provisions, but it is believed that the committee will report to the House a modified plan, whereby the respective states will determine the size of the pension rather than the Federal Government.

Just what modifications the committee will make in its reported bill cannot be determined, at least not until the chairman has conferred with the President. The modified plan proposed by the committee seems to leave control over the pension systems to the states themselves, with the administration of the federal funds being placed in the hands of a social insurance board.

The White House is the center of all directions. It is difficult to realize the extent to which Congress is called upon to enact precisely what is requested by the President. There is some resentment among the chairmen of committees to be asked to introduce an Administration bill without first being called to the White House for a discussion as to its form.

The so-called \$4 billion appropriation bill has been reported by the Senate Appropriation Committee and is now being debated on the floor. The President was able to have it reported by the committee without any broad modifications of the blank-check appropriation he requested, with no strings attached.
