One schofarship in agriculture and another in home economics is offered annually for every county of the state by the board of trustees Square Deal Party is a second type of scholarship on a competitive county basis and a third type which is available through members of the general assembly. Scholarships of the latter two types are good in any college of the university; as well as in agriculture or

Prospective students must file applications with the Illinois Farmers' institute in Springfield not later than May 31 if they wish to become applicants for the board of trustees in agriculture and another in home of the state with the exception of Cook and Lake counties. One of the important changes that has just been made in the regulations is that holders of them must rank in the upper half of their high chool graduating class, or if they have completed one year or more of follege work, they must have an average 15 points above passing in

Successful applicants for these board of trustees scholarships must pass with an average grade of 70or higher the county scholarship examination on the first Saturday in in the county in which they reside. This examination is held in ent of schools. The highest ranking agricultural and home economics applicant in each county examination, if otherwise eligible, will be awarded the board of trustees schol-

One scholarship good for any college of the university also is offered to the highest ranking of all stuin each of the county compet-

Each of the 204 members of the Illinois General Assembly also has Every one of the 263 students who a University of Illinois scholarship to be awarded annually to a student of his choice. This might be a student who contemplated enrolling in agriculture or home economics.

All of these scholarships are good for four years and exempt the hold er from the payment of the matricu lation and incidental fees of the university. They do not exempt the materials or from the special fees for instruction in applied music.
