A particularly interesting trip is being planned by Mrs. Maurice Pollak, state chairman on the food and drug laws, on Wednesday, May 1.

The first sixteen members of the League of Women Voters to register with Mrs. Pollak (H. P. 2246) will be taken by automobile to the office of the food and drug administration in Chicago, where, at 11 o'clock they will be shown the scientific tests which are being made daily to carry out the provisions of the present pure food law. Every housewife should be deeply

interested in this matter, as it so closely concerns the health of each member of her family. The League is one of the most persistent organizations in fostering the passage of laws to protect the consumer from purchasing harmful foods or drugs.
