which has been engaged for ten years in co-ordinating public works, park development and zoning in the Chicago region. It was eight years ago that they brought the Wisconsin and Illinois highway departments together to see if several bond issue routes could not be located, end to end, to make a continuous, interstate highway to relieve Sheridan and Green Bay Roads. The present Skokie Three-State Highway was nearby or best served it. the result. This year will see all parts of U. S. Highway 51, as it is now numbered, under contract.

The development of Railroad Avenue was actively pushed about the same time to further relieve Sheridan road and to provide an intervillage business thoroughfare. On the traffic now using Railroad Avenue, only 11 per cent is composed Store Opening Day of commercial vehicles most of

which are light delivery trucks. In addition to the idea of developing parallel highways to the west of Sheridan Road, it has been the policy of the Regional Planning Association to provide east and west connections from the lake shore at frequent intervals. It is important to give easy access to these by pass routes in order to attract vehicles that may be going some distance.

When Skokie. Highway becomes fully effective shore residents should not expect impossible reductions in traffic on Sheridan Road, according to origin and destination traffic data gathered in October, 1931. Results chtained on Sheridan Road at Calvary Cemetery showed that 84 per cent of the vehicles were to or from Cook County north shore towns, while only 11 per cent were to or from Lake County.


