

Chicago Choir to Give Concert Here Sunday



The Chicago Inter-City choir which will be heard in a sacred concert at the First United Evangelical church Sunday evening service on April 28, is a unique singing organization composed almost entirely of trained voices, singing pupils of the director, John L. Baker, who specializes in teaching pupils for sacred song and oratorio.

Mr. Baker who is also the recently appointed director of the Chicago United choir, is a master musician, having spent twelve years on the American concert and opera stage. He made his last appearance singing the title role in "Robin Hood."

A special number of the concert will be the anthem, "Oh Make a Joyful Noise 'Unto the Lord." This number was composed especially for the Inter-City choir by Mr. Baker, and features Miss Anne McCormack, coloratura lyric soprano.

The fact that this choir (which is less than three years old) has given over 200 concerts, over 100 of which have been repeat engagements, is a glowing testimony to their popularity and singing ability.

N. S. Line to Add "Commuters Specials"

Ravinia will be added to the suburban communities benefiting from the morning and evening "Commuters Specials" operated by the North Shore Line over the Shore Line route between Waukegan and the Chicago Loop.

The morning special, operating daily except Sunday, will receive commuters at Ravinia station at 8:06 a.m. (daylight saving time). Under the new schedule stops are made at North Chicago at 7:47 a.m., Lake Bluff at 7:51 a.m., Lake Forest at 7:54 a.m., Farwell's at 7:55 a.m., Highland Park at 8:03 a.m., and Glencoe at 8:10 a.m.

In the evening the special leaves Adams and Wabash station at 5:08 p.m. (daylight saving time), arriving in Ravinia at 5:52 p.m. This train, operating daily except Saturday and Sunday, also makes a non-stop run from Chicago Avenue to Glencoe, where it arrives at 5:49 p.m. under the new schedule.

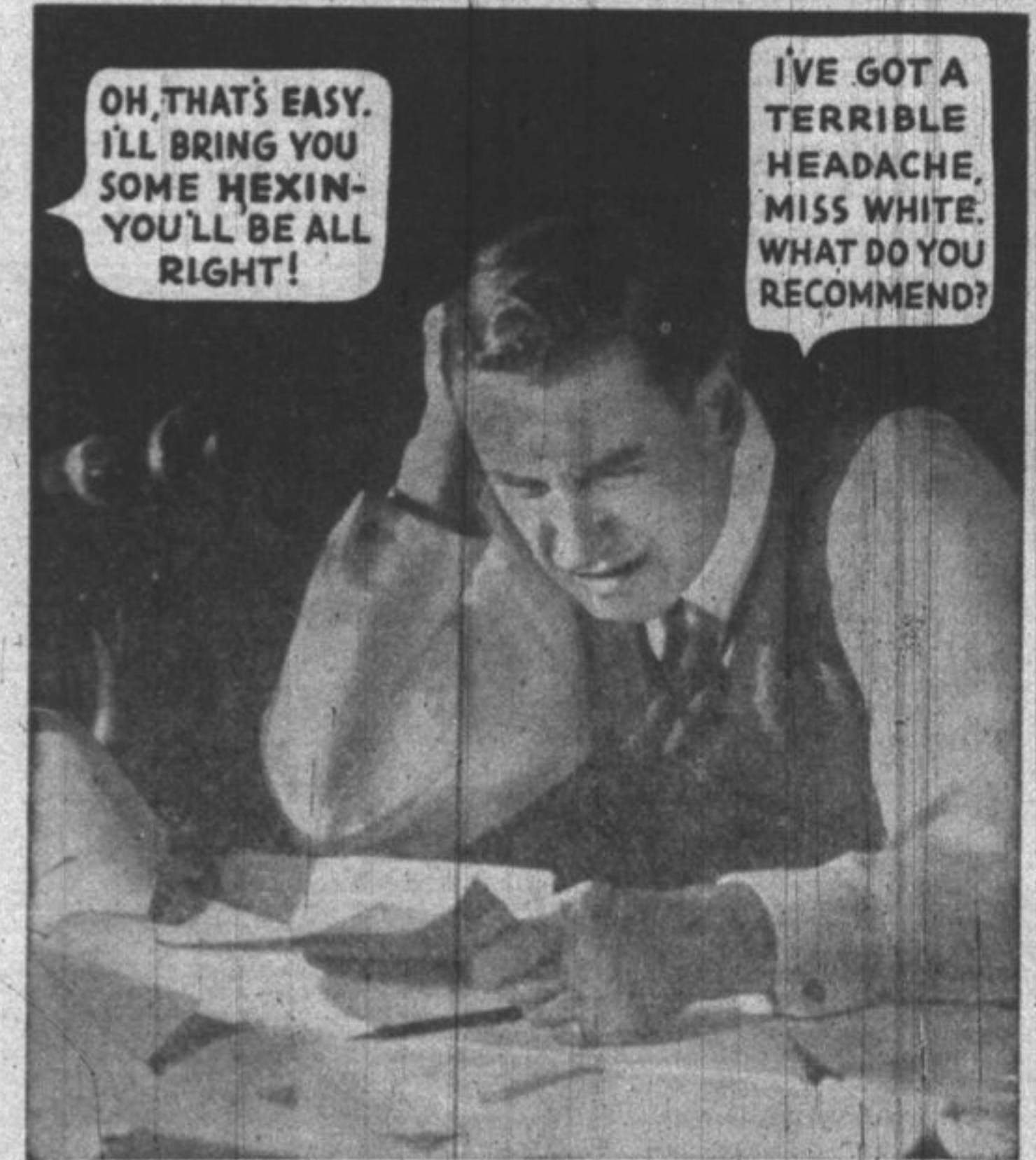

The mother is taught to plan and prepare the proper food for her children, by which the entire family should profit, she learns the best daily routine for her baby, and older children and is assisted in training them so as to establish good habits at an early age.

What special problems in nutrition or behavior arise the nurse has the assistance of a nutritionist or the mental hygiene supervisor. In 1934 the society had under its supervision 15,184 expectant mothers and children under six years old.
