In the evening the special leaves Adams and Wabash station at 5:08 p.m. (daylight saving time), arriving in Ravinia at 5:52 p.m. This train, operating daily except Saturday and Sunday, also makes a nonstop run from Chicago Avenue to Glencoe, where it arrives at 5:49 p. m., under the new schedule. It will reach Highland Park at 5:56 p.m., Farwell's at 6:05 p.m., Lake Forest at 6:06 p.m., Lake Bluff at 6:09 p.m. and North Chicago Junction at 6:13






