Solve Mystery of Grave Digging in Deerfield Cemetery

The mystery concerning the burial in Deerfield Cemetery without a permit has been solved. It was found that the remains placed there a few days ago by two women and a man were the ashes of Louisa Huck, a former resident of Deerfield, who died in San Diego, Calif., on August 25, 1934.

The new grave was discovered Saturday by Herman Ludwig, caretaker, who reported it to Theodore J. Knack, president of the cemetery association, who had no burial permit on file. The case was then reported to Police Chief Percy McLaughlin, who dug up the grave and found two pasteboard boxes, one containing a brass funeral urn. Both the urn and the boxes were filled with ashes.

On the outside of the box containing the urn a typewritten tag was found stating: "This package contains the incinerated remains of Louisa Huck" and the information that she was 67 years, 2 months and 23 days old at the time of her death August 25, 1934. It bore the name of the Greenwood Crematory, San Diego, Calif.

Mrs. Carrie Biederstadt, who lives with her daughter, Frances, just across from the cemetery on Central Avenue, Deerfield, saw the man digging the grave on that Saturday, just after lunch. She said she saw one of the women place a small box in the grave, after which the man covered the grave carefully, replacing the sod. The women walked out of the cemetery gate and the man climbed over the fence.

The Huck family are known as old settlers in this part of the country. John Jacob Huck, a Civil War

veteran, who died in 1899 was the father of a family which consisted of three girls, Louisa, Emma and Ellen, and one boy, Jacob. The family has not lived around Deerfield since the death of the father, but members have visited in Deerfield a number of times recently. It is reported that some of the family live in Lombard, Ill.

In addition to the recent grave of Louisa, the burial plot in the Deerfield Cemetery contains three graves, the father; his wife, Frederika, who died in 1890; and a daughter, Emma, who died in 1910.

The only question unsolved is why a permit was not filed with the cemetery or village officials.
