**State Geological Survey**  
**Announces Field Trip**

Inaugurating its 1935 schedule of earth history field trips for teachers and others interested in natural science, the Illinois State Geological Survey announces a conference field study of the geology and geologic history of the Chicago North Shore region, to be held on Saturday, May 11, with Prof. J. Harris Bretz, noted University of Chicago geologist, in charge.

The field trip group will assemble at New Trier High School in Winnetka at 9 a.m. on the day of the trip, and will spend most of the day observing the geology of northern Cook and southern Lake Counties. The major events of the Great Ice Age and their effect in shaping the topography and drainage of the Chicago area will be outlined and discussed. This will include the history of the formation and disappearance of ancient Lake Chicago, whose beach ridges, outlets and shore lines can still be traced. Dr. Bretz has recently completed a very detailed survey of the geology of the Chicago area, the results of which will be published this year by the State Geological Survey.

Besides that in the Chicago region, field work will be held this year in the Sycamore, Freeport, Paris, Carthage and Anna regions. Information concerning them may be secured by addressing Don L. Carroll, State Geological Survey, Urbana.
