"Everlasting Punishment" was the subject of the Lesson-Sermon in all Churches of Christ, Scientist, on Sunday, May 5.

The Golden Text was, "By mercy and truth iniquity is purged: and by the fear of the Lord men depart from evil" (Proverbs 16:6).

Among the citations which comprised the Lesson-Sermon was the following from the Bible: "O God, to whom vengeance belongeth, shew thyself. Lord, how long shall the wicked triumph? They break in pieces thy people, O Lord, and afflict thine heritage. He that planteth the ear, shall he not hear? he that formed the eye, shall he not see? He that chastiseth the heathen, shall not he correct? he that teacheth man knowledge, shall not he know? Blessed is the man whom thou chastenest, O Lord, and teachest him out of thy law" (Psalms 94:1, 3, 5, 9, 10, 12).

The Lesson-Sermon also included the following passages from the Christian Science textbook, "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures," by Mary Baker Eddy: "Whoever a man soweth, that shall he also reap. Error excludes itself from harmony. Sin is its own punishment" (p. 537).
