Girl Scouts To Have Home Camp Experience

A Girl Scout Day camp is announced as a new and important extension of Highland Park Scout activities. It will be held one day a week from 9:30 to 4:30, during July. The Park Commission has granted permission for the use of Sunset Woods, which is an ideal location, close enough to be reached easily on foot or bicycle. Fires for cooking lunch will be built with entire safety, as the Park Commission will put down a load of sand for that purpose.

Miss Adelmia Hadley, local director of the Skokie Area Girl Scout council, will be at the head of the staff now being selected, to be made up of experts—troop leaders and other women with Scout experience or special training in related fields. The camp will conform to the high Girl Scout camp standards in every way, with an adult to supervise every eight girls, and with a trained nurse or a certified Red Cross first aid expert in constant attendance.

At the last meeting of the New Trier Area Girl Scout council, it was voted that the name should be changed to the Skokie Area Girl Scout council. Representatives from Highland Park, Glencoe and Winnetka make up the council membership.

Grade School Track and Field Meet

Community Service Inc. is sponsoring a track and field meet for the grade school boys and girls of this and surrounding communities. On Saturday morning, May 25 starting at 9 a.m., at the Deerfield-Shields athletic field, located on West Park avenue, Highland Park. Any boy or girl who attends a grade school which ordinarily sends its graduates to the Deerfield-Shields High school is eligible to compete in this meet. Schools which have already entered teams in this meet are, Elm Place, Lincoln, and Ravinia all of Highland Park, and Deerfield, Lake Forest, Highwood, and St. James of Highwood.

The boys entering this meet will be divided into three classes, those boys under 100 pounds in weight, boys weighing 100 pounds or over, and those boys over 14 years of age regardless of their weight classification. The girls will be divided into two classes, those weighing under 90 pounds and those weighing 90 pounds or more. Each competitor is limited to two individual events and a relay, each school being allowed to enter three competitors in each class.

The events for the meet for each group is as follows: Boys under 90 pounds; 50 yard dash, 75 yard dash, high jump, broad jump, 8 pound shot, 220 yard relay; boys 100 pounds and over also boys over 14 years of age; 50 yard dash, 100 yard dash, high jump, broad jump, 8 pound shot, and 440 yard relay. Both girls divisions will have the same events, namely; 50 yard dash, high jump, broad jump, and 220 yard relay.

The meet will be conducted by the staff of Community Service Inc. Mr. Geo. Scheuchenpflug and Mr. Ray Cox. They will be assisted by the coaches from the various schools entering the meet and by members of the high school track team. Ribbons donated by the Highland Park Rotary club will be given to the first three place winners in each event and to the members of the winning relay teams. The public is invited to attend this meet. There is no charge.
