School would seek admission to the Lake Forest School in the fall, and this would mean considerable additional expense to this school district.

Hence it was after due consideration, that the local board of education, we are told, passed a motion to the effect that pupils from the non-high school district of Lake County term 1935-36 unless they pay one-half of the per capita cost in advance at the beginning of each semester.

At the present time the maximum rate in the non-high school districts of the state is fifty cents on \$100 assessed valuation. House Bill No. 297, which provides for a seventy-five cent maximum tax rate is pending in Springfield.

Saks to Open in North Shore Suburbs

Saks - Fifth avenue has leased three stores in North Shore suburbs for the summer months with an option to renew for a term of years. The leases which run from June 1 to October 1, are:

In the Orrington hotel, Evanston, 35 feet frontage on Orrington avenue, with a depth of approximately 50 feet in which will be carried sports apparel, consisting of dresses, hosiery, millinery, handbags, etc.

In Winnetka, at the Chimneys, store No. 5, approximately 38 feet by 65 feet, to be used as a sports shop carrying the same type of merchandise as in Evanston.

In addition, Saks will open its famous Saks-Antoine beauty salon.

In Lake Forest, Saks has leased a store 18x40 feet, in the Theater building on Deerpath. The main floor will be devoted to sports wear, while on the second floor will be a beauty salon, consisting of six booths and equipped to serve the Lake Forest public.

According to George M. Gleason, managing director of Saks-Fifth avenue, the reason for opening these shops is to be found in the many requests received from patrons of the beauty salons conducted for the past several years in the various North Shore suburbs, at the Lake Shore Country club and other clubs in the vicinity.

The Chimneys in Winnetka has been used as the base of operations which have proved sufficiently successful to warrant an extension of the idea.

Mr. Gleason expressed the opinion that the results during summer months will justify exercising the option for an all-year-round lease.
